4.1 Hearing – Proposed Amendment to the Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw 2009 – Langs Beach

1 Purpose

To review and receive the submissions and feedback to the proposed amendment of the Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw 2009 and to hear submitters that wish to be heard.

2 Recommendations

That the Council,

- 1. Receives the submissions to the proposed amendment of the Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw 2009.
- 2. Hears the submitters who wish to be heard in support of their submission to the proposed amendment of the Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw 2009.

3 Background

Council's Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw (the Bylaw) was first made in 2009. The Bylaw was last reviewed at the end of 2016. At its meeting on 27 June 2019, Council decided to consult with the community on a proposed amendment to the Bylaw to restrict vehicle access on part of Langs Beach.

The Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw aims to support public safety by restricting vehicles in those beach areas where there are significant conflicts between vehicles and pedestrian beach users. However, the Bylaw also aims to retain vehicles access for less busy beach areas that are suitable for vehicle access; to support the recreational needs of anglers, shellfish gatherers, the launching of small boats and other beach users.

To achieve a balance between competing uses, Council proposed to prohibit vehicle access on the north-western part of the beach, but continue to allow vehicle access to the beach area from the principle vehicle access point to the primary boat launching area

A full Statement of Proposal was publicly notified on 15th July 2019. To promote the consultation and encourage feedback, Council:

- Placed a public notice in the Whangarei Leader (Council Pages)
- Published information, including the Statement of Proposal on Council's website
- Published two articles in the Whangarei Leader (Council pages) about the consultation

- Notified local surf clubs, business associations and ratepayer groups by email
- Hand delivered a leaflet about the consultation to letter boxes in Langs Beach and to local businesses.

The public submission period opened on 15th July 2019 and closed at 5pm on 12th August 2019.

4 Discussion

4.3 Key issues raised

The following key themes have arisen from the submissions received:

- Setting a lower speed limit on the beach and enforcing that speed limit
- Creating a new vehicle access point for launching boats nearer the boat launching area
- Restricting access only to vehicles launching or retrieving boats or actively engaged in fishing
- Allowing some vehicle access to the north-western part of the beach during winter and outside peak times.
- Prohibiting vehicles on other beaches, including Uretiti, Waipu Wildlife Refuge and Ngunguru Sandspit

The table below sets out staff comments relating to the above key issues. All submissions are attached and should be referred to for more specific detail of individual submissions:

Restricting access only to vehicles launching or retrieving boats or actively engaged in fishing	005, 014, 023, 029, 031, 036, 039	Several submitters have noted that a number of vehicles access the beach for purposes other than launching or retrieval of boats and as such have no purpose on the beach. The relief sought does have merit as south-eastern end of the beach is also used by families as it provides more sheltered water. Restricting access for boat launching and retrieval, or fishing would reduce the numbers of vehicles using the beach and may reduce the number of faster vehicles on the beach. A legal review would be required to determine whether this approach is possible.
Allowing some vehicle access to the north-western part of the beach during winter and outside peak times.	010, 019, 020, 025,	Some submitters point out that local people access the north-western part of the beach with quad bikes to carry beach fishing equipment. This can be during the winter when there are few people on the beach. It is noted that there is direct pedestrian access to the northern end of the main beach. Allowing access outside of peak hours, or during winter would require the prohibition to apply only at certain times. Allowing only four-wheel quad bikes and similar vehicles for fishing purposes may create a confusing situation and be difficult to enforce.
Prohibiting vehicles on other beaches, including Uretiti, Waipu Wildlife Refuge and Ngunguru Sandspit	038, 048	Requests to include other beaches in the Bylaw is outside the scope of the current Bylaw amendment. Introducing new rules or prohibiting vehicles on other beaches would require a new consultation process.
Install improved signage and other physical barriers for areas where vehicles are banned.	017, 018, 032, 033, 034, 035, 039, 043, 049, 051	New signage will be required if the Bylaw is amended. The placement of signage to support a Bylaw is a Council operational matter and is outside of the remit of the Bylaw itself.
 Costal erosion issues Dog bans Impact on Dotterels 	006, 010, 015, 026, 029, 047	Submitters raise a number of additional points, including the impact of vehicles on Dotterels. One submission notes that the main Dotterel nesting area is on the northern part of the beach. Nests are seasonally fenced. The banning of Dogs on the Beach is outside the scope of the Control of Vehicles on Beaches Bylaw.

4.4 Next Stage

A briefing will be prepared for a Council Briefing meeting on 27th August. This briefing will provide additional technical or legal advice as required to address any issues raised at the hearing by submitters.

A formal deliberations meeting is scheduled for 05 September, where a report outlining the consultation process, summary of submissions and any recommendations arising from the hearing and/or Council briefing, including any legal review that may have been undertaken.

4.5 Financial/budget considerations

There are no financial or budget implications arising from the proposed amendment to the Control of Vehicles on Beaches bylaw 2009.

4.6 Policy and planning implications

Council is receiving submissions and hearing submitters that wish to be heard in support of their submission. There are no policy and planning implications.

4.7 Options

Council is receiving submissions and hearing submitters that wish to be heard in support of their submission. Options will be provided, once Council has heard and considered all submissions and are required to make a decision on those submissions.

No I do not support the proposed bylaw allowing vehicle access to the southern end of Langs Beach. I propose vehicle access be purpose built similar to the one currently used at the Cove Beach. I propose a road be formed down from an existing road that services the Langs beach southern residences. There are common green areas that could suit this purpose. i believe the whole of Langs Beach should only have walking access. My family settled in Waipu in 1952. We used to travel to Langs beach regularly for family outings. This was when the road was gravel. There were always many sea birds and land birds along the southern end of Langs beach because there was a wetlands formed from the river coming along the back of the beach. Where this came out onto the beach formed a hard pan area for fishermen to launch their boats. Where have these wetlands gone. Saving wetlands is of high environmental importance throughout New Zealand. Too many vehicles create compaction of sand and any movement/sound disturbances affect wildlife choosing to live there. I propose the vehicle access be formed on the southern side of this underground waterflow along the southern side of a shared green space and access only available to fishers who have applied for a key from MAF or DOC or WDC.

Hi

I think your proposal will solve a minor problem at Langs beach by prohibiting vehicles on the beach to the West/North to the left of the vehicle access way by the toilets and parking area. However the greater problem is road vehicles that use the East/South area. In summer as the sand dries out it becomes very soft in some areas. There is a large majority of utes and SUV's that drive on the beach (whether towing boats or otherwise) that find that they cannot get back onto the road easily as their vehicles become bogged in the soft sand. The solution they adopt almost universally is to take a run up to the steeper slope on the beach so they have enough momentum to get over the softer areas. Speeds are often in excess of 40 kph as they reach the top of the slope. The great danger is that this area has a lot of children playing there and people sitting on or lying on the sand which the drivers of these vehicles cannot see until they get over the top of the slope. There have been several cases of near misses in the last few years that I have witnessed. To ensure your proposal actually solves the greatest problem and a removes a probable cause of serious accidents it would seem that there should be a vehicle speed limit of 10 - 15 kph on any area of the beach. I have no issue with road vehicles using the beach in a safe manner whether they are tractors, cars, utes, SUV's or buggies as long as they do not cause a danger to other beach users.

I would like to make my submission in person please.

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over the dunes at Langs Beach to access the beach; safety of beach users was our main concern at the time. Children using the swings just past the bridge were often put at risk by vehicles accessing the open sand area in front of the swings. The following vehicles have driven from the road directly on to the beach at several points along the northern two thirds of the beach, ignoring the vehicle access by the toilet block; 2 and 4 WD cars of all sizes, quad bikes, off road mules, tractors, motorbikes, camper vans and even a small bus at one stage. Many of these vehicles have become bogged down and required considerable time and energy to remove.

Since the group formed we have worked collaboratively with the Northland Regional Council, the Whangarei District Council, the Department of Conservation and many community members to not only make access to the beach safer, but also improve the natural environment. We have expanded our core role to include assistance with dune vegetation and shorebird fencing, both of these activities assist with limiting vehicle access in a positive and enriching way.

The Langs Beach Restoration Group would support the move by the Whangarei District Council to prohibit vehicles at all times from using Langs Beach north of the toilet block entrance. We offer our assistance and would help with sign placement and vehicle monitoring where deemed necessary. Once again thank you for the opportunity to submit on this proposed vehicle bylaw change at Langs Beach.

1. Introduction

The Lang Cove Residents Association (LCRA) is a group representing owners of the south end of Lang's Beach, with special interest in the use and protection of and access to Lang's Beach.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE VEHICLES ON BEACHES BYLAW 2009

- 2. In general, the LCRA supports the intention of the Whangarei District Council to support public safety by restricting vehicles, to avoid significant conflicts between vehicles and pedestrian beach users and to keep all beach users safe.
- 3. The LCRA agrees with the proposal to prohibit vehicles at all times from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Road to the north western end of the beach.
- 4. The south-eastern end of the beach is popular as a launch point for small boats. The safety of this part of the beach, due to the natural breakwater created by the rocky outcrop means it has always been popular with families and swimmers in the busy summer months.
- 5. The LCRA would like to have the speed limit set at 10 km/hour and also have a fine able to be levied by council on vehicles who break the speed limit.
- 6. In summary, the LCRA supports -
 - 6.1. Vehicle access being restricted from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Rd to the north western end of the beach. This should include amphibious vehicles (Sealegs)
 - 6.2. A 10 km/hour speed limit on the southern end of Lang's Beach
 - 6.3. A fine being able to be levied by the Council on owners of vehicles who break the speed limit
 - 6.4. Signage being erected at the vehicle access point with the above information
- 7. The LCRA seeks to be heard at the forthcoming hearing.

The Bream Bay Coastal Care Trust supports the proposal to limit vehicles to those launching boats at the southern end of the beach as shown on the map.

This a sensible compromise protecting people walking or sunbathing on the beach while allowing small boat owners to continue to use the beach for launching.

New Zealand dotterel are known to nest at the northern end of the beach in spring and summer. Dotterel nests and chicks are well camouflaged in the sand so vulnerable to being run over by vehicles.

• The Bream Bay Coastal Care Trust would also like to see a vehicle free zone established in front of the Uretiti campground where families, many with young children, spend their summer holidays and have to share the beach with numerous vehicles, many of them exceeding the 30kmph beach speed limit. The numbers of vehicles accessing the beach at Tip Rd. and driving north to the beach in front of the campground has increased markedly over the past few summers.

• We would also like the area of beach that is part of the Waipu Wildlife Refuge north of the Waipu estuary recognized by the Whangarei District Council as a vehicle free zone under the Vehicles on Beaches by-law. Vehicles, often with dogs on board, drive up the beach and into the shorebird nesting area at the estuary. There is also a problem with trail bikes travelling up the beach and entering the dunes just north of the estuary. In fact this area of duneland is well known by trail bike riders as far away as Auckland as an informal bike park. The dunes here are being completely destroyed and resemble a moonscape. There is very little enforcement of the rules around dune protection and safe beach driving.

For most of the Winter there is no one on the Beach at all during the winter weeks, and only occasionally during the Winter weekends. There is in my opinion no need to change the existing rule. A far bigger issue for me are the dogs that are on the Beach all year round, mostly off leash and scaring the little kids and fouling the Beach. Although there is a dog ban over summer on the Beach it is generally ignored. To be fair most dog owners are responsible and clean up after their pets but usually let them off leash to exercise. I guess if the law does change and vehicles are totally banned from the Northern end that will mean that the revolting looking fence posts that were installed by the visual vandals to supposedly protect the sand dunes can be ripped out and we will have our stunning view back again.

Further to our telephone conversation I confirm that we want to retain ability to launch boats at the sheltered end of Langs Beach.

We are concerned about light vehicles driving at high speed in order to cross soft sand. Light vehicles often get stuck and have to wait for a kind-hearted tractor driver to pull them out. Some tractor drivers are fed up with the "high speed" issue and "getting stuck" issue – these tractor drivers are inclined to leave light vehicles sitting stuck for a while to discourage them from doing it again. Over the past three or four years an increasing number of people have figured out how to access the beach with a light four-wheel drive vehicle. A low speed limit (20km/hr?) would address this problem. Enforcement will not be a problem – a few words from the mother of a small child on the beach should do the trick for most people.



As a longtime bach owner at Langs Beach (and someone who is in residence during most of the summer months) the only vehicle access that I have observed in the proposed banned zone have been an occasional quad bike being used for either launching or retrieving a fishing longline, or SeaLegs boats landing or launching from the main beach area. Neither of these have appeared to cause any issue with summer beach users, and typically both instances have been outside the peak beach usage times ie 9AM to 5PM. The only other vehicles I have observed on the affected beach area have been Polaris farm type wagons. We, my husband Peter McGregor and I, have owned a property at 7 Lang Road for 15 years and spend a lot of time on the beach with dogs and children. We have experienced numerous incidents of 'joy riding' on all parts of the beach which endangers children, dogs and the nests of dotterels and oyster catchers. It is also unsettling to sit on a beach with vehicles doing wheelies just a short distance away and when people are too lazy to carry their gear 10 metres to the beach so drive their vehicle right onto the hightide area.

We therefore support driving restriction on the beach but please note that your option to support or oppose the proposal is not sufficient.

What seems to have been ignored in the proposal is that the majority of dotterel nests are built at the Southern end of the beach and although the boat launching tractors do not usually cross up into the area above high tide where the nests are, this is not true of 'joy riders' who often are unaware of the nests, (or even of people walking along the beach) and cut swathes through the area with their beach buggies or sometimes large 4 wheel drive vehicles. I have even see a large 4WD ignore the DOC tape indicating nesting and drive right through. Under your proposed bylaw this would not be illegal as it occurred at the Southern end of the beach.

Until a few years ago, when Whangarei Council developed guidelines for driving on beaches, there was a sign indicating vehicles were not allowed on the beach at all except for the purpose of launching boats at the Southern end. I am not sure whether this was actually a bylaw but it worked much better than the current law. This is the position we would like to see reinstated.

Therefore

1. We support the proposed total ban on vehicles on the Northern half of the beach.

2. We support the proposal to retain access for the purpose of boat launching on the Southern half of the beach

3. We strongly suggest an amendment that prohibits vehicles from any part of the beach except for boat launching purposes.

4. As an additional point, we would like to see the Council negotiate boat access through the public land in Lang Cove - ie a road direct to the boat launching area. This would negate any need to drive along the beach and make it a much safer and more attractive.

SUBMISSION BY Noel Davies 20 Gazelle Way, Lang Beach 8 August 2019

1. Introduction

I am a resident of Lang Cove and have a holiday home at 20 Gazelle Way. We frequently use the beach for swimming, walking, boat and jet ski launching using a tractor and we have a side by side 4x4 which is used to transport people and beach equipment to and from the beach.

I have a particular interest in seeing access to and from and on the beach controlled, as we have witnessed some dangerous, reckless, irresponsible behaviour on the beach, most of which is not from local residents, but by visitors to the beach.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE VEHICLES ON BEACHES BYLAW 2009

- 2. In general, I support the intention of the Whangarei District Council to support public safety by restricting vehicles, to avoid significant conflicts between vehicles and pedestrian beach users and to keep all beach users safe.
- 3. I agree with the proposal to prohibit vehicles at all times from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Road to the north western end of the beach and would like to see the installation of bollards on the beach to prevent this from happening.
- 4. The south-eastern end of the beach is popular as a launch point for boats, jet skis, kayaks etc. The safety of this part of the beach, due to the natural breakwater created by the rocky outcrop means it has always been popular with families and swimmers in the busy summer months.
- 5. I would like to have the speed limit set at 15 km/hour and have a fine able to be levied by council on vehicles who break the speed limit. A speed below 15 km would make it difficult for tractors to negotiate the beach without being stuck.
- 6. Additionally, visitors to the beach often park their vehicles on each side of the accessway to the beach blocking the way for tractors and the like and some of the vehicles concerned have suffered damage. We would like to see the installation of bollards of the access way to the beach with a No Parking sign installed.
- 7. In the longer term, because of the popularity of the beach, the WDC will have to consider increasing vehicle parking areas at both ends of the beach.
- 8. In summary, I support:
 - 8.1. Vehicle access being banned from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Rd to the north western end of the beach. This should include amphibious vehicles, for example, Sealegs and Quad bikes, side by side 4x4 and all other vehicles.
 - 8.2. The installation of wooden bollards on the beach to prevent such access.
 - 8.3. The introduction of a 15 km/hour speed limit on the southern end of Lang's Beach
 - 8.4. The introduction of a fine being able to be levied by the Council on owners of vehicles who break the speed limit.
 - 8.5. Signage being erected at the vehicle access point with the above information.
 - 8.6. The installation of wooden bollards on each side of the access way to the beach to prevent vehicles from parking there.
 - 8.7. The installation of a "No Parking" sign on the access way.

1. Introduction

I am a resident of Lang Cove and have a holiday home at 20 Gazelle Way. We frequently use the beach for swimming, walking, boat and jet ski launching using a tractor and we have a side by side 4x4 which is used to transport people and beach equipment to and from the beach.

I have a particular interest in seeing access to and from and on the beach controlled, as we have witnessed some dangerous, reckless, irresponsible behaviour on the beach, most of which is not from local residents, but by visitors to the beach.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE VEHICLES ON BEACHES BYLAW 2009

- 2. In general, I support the intention of the Whangarei District Council to support public safety by restricting vehicles, to avoid significant conflicts between vehicles and pedestrian beach users and to keep all beach users safe.
- 3. I agree with the proposal to prohibit vehicles at all times from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Road to the north western end of the beach and would like to see the installation of bollards on the beach to prevent this from happening.
- 4. The south-eastern end of the beach is popular as a launch point for boats, jet skis, kayaks etc. The safety of this part of the beach, due to the natural breakwater created by the rocky outcrop means it has always been popular with families and swimmers in the busy summer months.
- 5. I would like to have the speed limit set at 15 km/hour and have a fine able to be levied by council on vehicles who break the speed limit. A speed below 15 km would make it difficult for tractors to negotiate the beach without being stuck.
- 6. Additionally, visitors to the beach often park their vehicles on each side of the accessway to the beach blocking the way for tractors and the like and some of the vehicles concerned have suffered damage. We would like to see the installation of bollards of the access way to the beach with a No Parking sign installed.
- 7. In the longer term, because of the popularity of the beach, the WDC will have to consider increasing vehicle parking areas at both ends of the beach.
- 8. In summary, I support:
 - 8.1. Vehicle access being banned from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Rd to the north western end of the beach. This should include amphibious vehicles, for example, Sealegs and Quad bikes, side by side 4x4 and all other vehicles.
 - 8.2. The installation of wooden bollards on the beach to prevent such access.
 - 8.3. The introduction of a 15 km/hour speed limit on the southern end of Lang's Beach
 - 8.4. The introduction of a fine being able to be levied by the Council on owners of vehicles who break the speed limit.
 - 8.5. Signage being erected at the vehicle access point with the above information.
 - 8.6. The installation of wooden bollards on each side of the access way to the beach to prevent vehicles from parking there.
 - 8.7. The installation of a "No Parking" sign on the access way.

My family has a property at Langs Beach which we regularly use. We regularly enjoy pedestrian access to and use of the beach, as do many other people, including many families with young children.

I fully support the proposal for the very reasons stated on the proposal itself, namely the need to manage the growing conflict between vehicular and pedestrian usage for the north-western end of Langs Beach.

We need an enforceable bylaw to not only deter vehicles from accessing this part of the beach, but also to allow pedestrian beach users to feel confident that they could approach the driver to remind them of the bylaw and if necessary, report unlawful vehicular access with confidence that some action could be taken against the vehicle owner.

The fact that there was a by-law, clear signage stating that, and that they could be easily reported (by simply taking a photo and noting the registration number), would also deter vehicle drivers from transgressing.

This end of the beach usually has more people on it than the south-eastern end. It is usually steeper and at high-tide, there is a relatively narrow stretch of the beach that does not lend itself at all to being shared with vehicles

Even at Low tide, the beach is mostly too steep and the sand too soft for practical vehicle access

There are no suitable launching points for boats or jet skis, so no need for vehicles to access this part of the beach for that purpose.

Although current signage at the beach access instructs vehicle drivers to avoid accessing this part of the beach, the words to that effect are relatively obscure being "in the fine print". A clear and independent sign alerting users to the (proposed) by-law would be more helpful. I am comfortable with vehicle access remaining for the south-eastern end of the beach, as this is not only accepted common practice, but clearly the only practical option for safe launching and retrieval of boats from the beach. However, I would endorse any proposals or actions to strengthen limitations to the type of vehicles accessing the beach (ie restricted to vehicles towing boats or other marine recreational vehicles such as jet-skis, and a limit to the speed at which they can travel on that section of the beach.

In summary, I fully support and endorse the proposed change, and would recommend associated changes to signage at the beach access point to ensure vehicle drivers were readily alerted to the restrictions to vehicular access to the beach.

We the Trustees of the Esveld Family Trust support the Proposed Bylaw amendment. This prohibits all types of vehicle access to that part of Langs beach North-West of the existing vehicle access, shown on Map 3.

We support the proposal for the following reasons:

1) Incompatible uses

Vehicles are totally incompatible with all recreational activities that occur on this and all beaches. Unlike roads, open spaces do not provide visual cues for drivers or beach-goers to be alert to each other's potential actions. This, combined with the sights and sounds of the naturally leisurely environment makes the use of vehicles the ultimate safety risk. People swimming, playing, walking and chatting should not have to be alert to the presence of vehicles. As footpaths are the preserve of pedestrians, beaches must be the preserve of people enjoying the outdoors.

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2) Protection of the natural environment

Vehicle use on beaches destroys the fragile ecosystem of the beach. It is gratifying to see the timber pole barriers recently installed alongside Cove Road and the beach which now prevents vehicle access by 4-wheel-drives which was occurring at the NW end despite substantial level changes between berm and sand. The Proposed Amendment further reinforces the existing timber pole barriers to exclude vehicles from the beach.

3) Protection of wildlife

Current access allowing vehicles to the South-East conflicts with the breeding areas of threatened northern NZ dotterel and caspian tern. Both of these species are classified as threatened. Areas are seasonally fenced to assist bird numbers to recover, however, long term this is probably a forlorn hope. Fairy terns have already disappeared due to beach degradation.

It is hoped, the prohibition of vehicles to the North-West will increase the chances of recovery of bird species and of pipi and tuatua beds.

Ngunguru Sandspit Protection Society Incorporated (NSaPS) thanks the Whangarei District Council for the opportunity to comment on the bylaw amendment proposal which the Society supports.


One of the aims of NSaPS is to promote the protection of the historical, cultural and natural values of the Ngunguru Sandspit and its associated coastal area. The Society plays an important part acting as a guardian of this outstanding area. Its role is made difficult by vehicles on the sandspit ocean and estuary beaches where native and migrant shorebirds (e.g. dotterels, variable oyster catchers, Bar-tailed godwit) breed and feed.

NSaPS submitted to WDC in 2009 and 2012 regarding prohibiting vehicles on the Ngunguru Sandspit beaches.

NSaPS works closely with iwi/hapu/whanau and requests Council's co-operation to designate this wahi tapu and ecologically sensitive site to be a 'no-go' area on the beaches for vehicles north of the boundary between the Crown Ngunguru Sandspit Reserve and private land. Beyond this boundary the sandspit is out of bounds for vehicles and there is no need for vehicles to access these beaches as the 'road' leads to nowhere: it is not a means to get from Point A to B.

A bylaw preventing vehicles on these beaches, together with appropriate Council signage, would assist the volunteers in educating the public of the sandspit's values and encourage awareness of the site.

The two existing, private, unsealed roads leading from Ngunguru Ford Road to near the spit are for landowners on Maori land and are not for access to the beach. The present general title private land bordering the Reserve has no legal road access to it. However, people presently gain unofficial vehicle access to the beaches through these private roads and land. Without official signs and a bylaw in place it is hard to prevent vehicle use on the beaches.

I am writing to voice my concerns again, I have written several times before, with regards to vehicles and the speed limit of vehicles on Langs Beach.

I agree with making the new proposed Amendment to the Vehicle on Beaches Bylaw which prohibited any vehicles to the west of the entry to the beach law.

But I feel that what you are proposing doesn't address on of the main issues with regards to vehicles on the eastern side of the beach. My concern with this is that to entry the beach at Lang Beach there is a large area of soft sand that has to be negotiated before your get to the harder sand below the high water mark. Many of these drives believe that to navigate this soft sand it needs to be approached at high speed and are often exceeding the 30kph speed limit as they come onto and off the beach. This entry to the beach is also one of the busiest for foot traffic with many young children, as well as adults heading backwards and forwards to their parked cars. As these vehicle's negotiated the soft sand at speed they have very little control and I can see before long there is a good chance a serious accident will happen as someone steps into the path of one of these vehicles or one of these vehicles loses control.

I note that the Whangarei District council has recently erected a new sign at the entry to Langs Beach. I have attached a photo of this new sign. This new sign seems to try and take the owness of any accident that may happen off the council or warn people of the chance of an accident. Surely we should not have to hold children's hands when they are playing on a beach. Shouldn't a beach be a place where children can have freedom?

I believe that to reduce the risk of a serious accident the council need to reduce the legal speed limit on the beach to 15 kph and it needs to ensure that this is policed. I have also attached a photo of a vehicle which as you can see is not loaded legally, this vehicle was later seen hitting the soft sand in excess of 30 kph. I feel that 30 kph is too fast and if a vehicle cannot navigate the beach at a slower speed of 15kph it shouldn't have access to the beach. Also we need to enforce the speed limit and illegal driving.

The southern corner of the beach, being sheltered water by the rocky outcrop which forms the point, has always been a popular place for swimmers and families. In the mid 1990s the council put a culvert on to the beach, which replaced the access shown in attached photo.

With no suitable framework/ bylaw in place this has led to many unsafe actions by vehicles.

Unless you take strong action very soon, it is a matter of when and not if there will be a very serious (if not fatal) accident.

I would ask that you implement the following :

- 1.1. Vehicle access being restricted from 20m northwest of the vehicle beach access off Cove Rd to the north western end of the beach. This should include amphibious vehicles (Sealegs)
- 1.2. A 10 km/hour speed limit on the southern end of Langs Beach
- 1.3. A decent sized fine being able to be levied by the Council on owners of vehicles who break the speed limit
- 1.4. Signage being erected at the vehicle access point with the above information
