Legislation

LGA

- (a) establish and maintain processes to provide opportunities for Māori to contribute to the decision-making processes of the local authority; and
- (b) consider ways [to] foster the development of Māori capacity to contribute to the decisionmaking processes of the local authority;

RMA: *in relation to managing the use, development, and protection of natural and physical resources . . . take into account the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi*

Participation/partnership in decision making processes vs. representation? He Whakaputanga? LGA/standing order constraints?



Recap

- History
- Te Kārearea hapū based (Council resolved not to become a signatory of Te Kahu o Taonui Relationship Agreement)
- Initial hui held 08 November 2019, challenges and opportunities exercise:
 - Potential for Te Kārearea to become a standing committee
 - Potential for a staged approach to representation over time
 - Resourcing for hapū involvement in Council's processes
 - Communication between, and capability building of, both partners
 - Different tiers/mechanisms for Council's relationship with Māori (i.e. project, process, organisation, and Te Huinga/Te Kārearea based)
 - A need for clarity around the different relationships with Council, and the processes for any outside of Te Huinga
- An overarching desire to be more strategic



Direction before Christmas

Meetings held with both Council and Te Huinga executive with:

- Initial Te Huinga support for a standing committee
- A desire to also provide voice/participation for urban Māori
- A request for budget information
- A draft Terms of Reference being sought



Potential points of contention

- Meeting schedule
- Membership/quorum
- How to strengthen partnership, particularly under option 2 given the constraints of standing orders
- He Whakaputanga capacity building
- Voice/participation of urban Māori
- Budget constraints and potentially competing expectations



Governance Options for Participation

- 1. Te Kārearea Advisory Committee (status quo, Relationship Agreement)
- 2. Te Kārearea as a committee of Council (draft ToR circulated)
- 3. Membership on Committees (existing committee ToR apply)

Note; for options 1 and 2 it is proposed to meet monthly for the first six months, followed by quarterly with community/technical forums/hui in the intervening months
