4.1 Delegation to Tasmania – water reform – approval of Mayoral travel and expenses

Meeting: Extra ordinary Whangarei District Council

Date of meeting: 11 March 2020

1 Purpose

To approve Mayoral travel and expenses in accordance with Council's Policy for allowances and reimbursement of expenses to Elected Members.

2 Recommendation

That Council

1. Approve the Mayoral travel and expenses in accordance with Council's Policy on allowances and reimbursement of expenses to Elected Members.

3 Background

The government is reviewing how to improve the management of drinking water, storm water and waste water (three waters) to better support New Zealand's prosperity, health, safety and environment. Three waters services are a core responsibility of local councils.

Councils are taking a pro-active approach to working together to advance their understanding of the three waters challenges in their regions and to think about potential options and solutions.

The Minister of Local Government Hon Nanaia Mahuta has invited Mayor Sheryl Mai to join a delegation, comprising Mayors', iwi representatives and senior government officials from throughout New Zealand, to travel to Tasmania to gain insights into the Tasmanian experience of changing the way they deliver three waters services. Tasmania has dealt with some of the same issues we face in New Zealand including different historical levels of investment in water infrastructure. While there is no suggestion that the model is the best one for New Zealand, there are lessons that can be learnt from the experience.

4 Discussion

HWM Sheryl Mai has indicated her intention to travel to Tasmania (31 March – 3 April), conditional on the approval by Council of Mayoral travel and expenses in accordance with the remuneration expenses policy.

4.1 Financial/budget considerations

Council's Policy for allowances and reimbursement of expenses to Elected Members (adopted 27 February 2020), states that 'the prior approval of the Council is required for all events when held overseas'. As a general policy all elected member international air travel is by way of economy class. Other costs such as accommodation, meal and related incidental expenses can also be reimbursed providing they are in accordance with Council's Policy.

Council has an annual budget for attendance at conferences, courses, seminars or training.

5 Significance and engagement
