#### Annual Plan Feedback:

 PROPOSED REGIONAL COMMUNITY CENTRE MULTIPURPOSE RECREATION AND INDOOR SPORTS FACILITY FOR ELDERLY & DISABLED IN NORTHLAND

WDC needs to provide space, land and buildings for this Project. My continued campaign for a Community Regional multipurpose facility, complex, centre and obviously my first option is the (ex-Countdown Building) for this Project as per my previous submissions to provide for the elderly and disabled and youth and mothers, grandparents have nowhere to go during the week, bad weather and during school holidays. Special Requirements and Facilities for more Disability Covered Carparking, Safe, Warm, Inviting Environment and in winter it is warm in summer it is cool and also that the seating is suitable for all elderly and disability people which is commonly overlooked by main stream facilities. No consultation for Elderly and disability people for new buildings for design and accessibility. Disappointed in the lack of consultation and no response to my letters, support letters and petition in 2014 with NRC & WDC in regard to the ex-Countdown Land & Building - the obvious extreme waste of ratepayers money with security, fencing and vacant building with maintenance and dangerous asbestos in roof for 4-5 years. Grey Power supports this Project. DPA Northland supports this Project. Regional Elderly & Disability Action Group in Northland supports this project and I have other letters of support for this Project. I believe that WDC Mayor and WDC current Councillors are seriously overlooking the concerns about future planning for Whangarei and Northland for the ever growing elderly and disabled population and the lack of facilities for public use in recreation, social and sports.

#### 2. FIRES BANS

My opinion is and that of years with my farming experience is that fires need to be controlled and lit in the summer time because of the wood material being dry and less pollution when burnt and it brings rain. WDC need to have training and workshops for unskilled people who do not know how to light and manage a fire (eg, where to light it, how to light, how to control it and how to plan if it gets out of control). That the Fire Permits are taking too long to issue as the environment can change quickly and then I can not use it and also WDC Staff can cancel fire permits with no explanation. I am concerned that the Fire Trucks are being used as emergency response for car accidents which are occurring too often and Councils and Government are not funding these resources so when we need as rural, urban, lifestyle blocks or farmers need this resource or services they are not available.

#### 3. KAURI DIE BACK

I asked at a meeting about Kauri Die Back where is it? The location and where on a map but have also been ignored and concerned that the information and data collected is not made public. I believe that the borer beetles because the kauri tree stick out above the bush and the tree is in the flight path of the beetle and they rest on the bark and branches and leave behind their eggs. Also I have seen this happening out in the farm where trees are dying and the beetles are killing other tree species as well this needs to be investigated as a real concern and could be the reason for Kauri Die Back.

#### 4. ROADING

The WDC are currently doing road upgrading in the area but not sealing them which is waste time and ratepayers money as they quickly return to a worser state than before with more potholes and corrugated erosion. Concerned that Wrights Road, Pipiwai roadworks was a waste of time and money for dust control little bits and pieces when the entire road should been sealed at the same time.

#### 5. WEEDS ON SIDE OF ROADS

I want to talk about weeds that are on the side of the road next to farm land. This is the responsibility of WDC to maintain road verges. Only when I complain does the WDC say it belongs to NRC and visa vera so someone needs to take responsibility. It is not the farm or land owner should be doing this and WDC should make this part of annual plan for management.

#### 6. RUATANGATA COMMUNITY HALL

I asked for an extra street light on another pole which would shine for people with disability and elderly down the ramp — health & safety issues. The light has been changed but the new light is useless and needs to be moved as it isn't working. I have brought this up at WDC Have your Say Meeting and have had no action. The WDC is refusing to give the Community Hall Committee funding there has been no explanation in writing and we need this need actioned for WDC to support our community and local hall. WDC staff have indicated that the community own the hall but WDC gives funding to other Halls in the same situation but refuses to help our Hall.

#### 7. GUMTOWN ROAD - CULVERTS TOO NARROW

I have repeatly asked that the Gumtown Road is reviewed and accessed as the road is too narrow and there needs to be extra culverts. The Grader Driver blocks the culverts.

#### 8. TREE SPECIES & SELECTION FOR FUTURE PLANTING ON ROAD VERGES AND AREAS

I am concerned that the WDC is making unprofessional decisions about what species and type of trees are planted in public areas and near roads and buildings (eg, leaf fall blocking drains and causing flooding, kauri trees next to buildings, root bound trees pulling up footpaths & wastewater, stormwater, powerlines & fences, etc)

#### 9. RUBBISH DUMPED ON SIDE OF ROADS

I have concerns about Rubbish Truck having unsecured loads which is spread over the roads and into the water tables and then will pollute the rivers and our Harbours.

#### 10. DOG PARK

I would like to say I support the Dog Park but I believe that the drainage is overly excessive and expensive I think this needs to be investigated. Also that WDC should provide wider footpaths for people in wheelchairs with dogs.

#### **Dear WDC Councillors**

Anna Murphy has suggested that I submit this to the Annual Plan thus enabling all WDC Councillors the opportunity to read it.

I wish to revisit our request for a 1KM seal extension from end of existing seal to the second bridge on Waiotoi Road, Ngunguru.

Having viewed the list of roads that are scheduled to have seal extensions during this coming year I am of the opinion the selection process is flawed when the number of properties that use Waiotoi Road are considered. I make the following points.

- 60 residences use the road daily not the 33 used in the seal extension shortlist and most have multiple vehicles in their households
- Our petition presented to the Mayor 2 years ago showed 88% of ratepayers on Waiotoi and Pukenui Roads supported the seal extension
- Now that the paper track between Pukenui and Te Toiroa Roads has been upgraded we have seen a marked increase in vehicular through traffic which has effectively made it a through road thus increasing traffic flow
- The continued maintenance of Waiotoi Road and subsequent dust and runoff had degraded the water quality of our adjacent stream
- The maintenance cost to regrade and roll Waiotoi Road must be significant (last grading and roll 2 weeks ago and is already pot holed and corrugated again)
- The Tutukaka coast contributes approximately \$10m annually to the Whangarei district and we see very little going back into our coastal community
- Waiotoi Road is a school bus route
- Applying the proposed ratepayer contribution scheme the actual cost to WDC is minimal

In conclusion I urge you to include Waiotoi Road in this year's seal extension budget.

I think there should be rates cuts for businesses. Zero rates increase for all.

And please cut some allowances and/or salary for councillors and staff - a small percentage (token).

#### Projects/Plans

Please look at some projects for later this year, in all departments, and postpone them. Assess ones which the public would like/need and ones that would make the city 'safer' or 'better', and build these. They want libraries, rather than some footpath improvements. Make a list of possible projects and ask, via Facebook or whatever, which of these could be postponed. You might be surprised. Don't do too much cancelling, council contractors need work!

#### CBD.

Help shift some business (which are still going) to move out of streets that should be shopping areas no longer. Rush plans to allow charities to turn some empty buildings into small apartments, nothing flash as hopefully they would soon be demolished, the land would have a good planned use in the future, and be rebuilt on soon. (On the outskirts of the CBD, 'temporary' apartments such as these could be bigger with room for car parks etc.)

Save money within the organisation.

Ask staff for their own suggestions (anonymous) about how to cut council spending, often good ideas come from ideas like this. Even turning the heating down 1degree can save a lot. Staff should not be working in shirt sleeves in winter. Ask the government to slow down on projects they insist the councils take over. Publicise them, so they could be a general election issue. E.g. Water issues being centralised. (Look at the huge salaries Watercare's bosses have!!) Don't look for problems with minor infringements, have a positive 'can do' attitude. But mediate, don't upset communities. (Law suits cost money). Plan for the future. More work will be done from home, so the larger version of the Council Chambers is not needed. I do think the rebuilding is necessary, just not planned for future larger staff working there. Less planes will fly in the future, Onerahi is a good airport, aim for 6 flights a day of the 50 seaters, that would be great! And Ruakaka or up north are not good alternatives, they are too close to other airports. A pandemic is a good 'reality check' on excess. Staff need to be reminded their money comes from ratepayers..... Suggest they double check for basic

things in projects, e.g so they don't need to dig up

recently done work to fix pipes below etc.

The fundraisers would be set up and organised by the Hikurangi Business Association, in conjunction with local sports clubs, halls, schools and any other community groups with the profits going to the community group.

There would be no further financial burden on council as the fundraisers would be self funded going forward with some of the riders fees going towards the maintenance & running costs such as toilets and traffic management.

The group wanting to fund raise would need to commit volunteers for the event.

With the Covid 19 lock down basically halting pokie machine use, sports clubs are hurting financially and could do with extra funds, these fundraisers would be a more positive way of fundraising for the clubs going forward.

There is a large demand for trail bike rides and mountain bike tracks in Northland. Currently there are only 5 or 6 trail bike rides in the greater Whangarei area per year, they generally fund raise for the local school or hall. Over the years many rides have been discontinued due to farmers health and safety requirements or the farmers not wanting the hastle of many riders on their land. So if a local group or sports club can not organize a ride with local farmers etc they don't get a shot at fund raising through trail bike rides.

With this model a local group would only need to come up with the volunteers for the mountain biking or trail bike riding and they could have a fundraiser.

This would be a much better use of council land then leaving it for the drug growers and rubbish dumpers. Each small event would bring extra customers to the Hikurangi town center which would benefit the local businesses



The scheme was a public works project done by the government in the late 1960's and handed over to the Council to manage

There are other food schemes in Kaihu, Awanui and Kaeo that are not targeted Rate levies. Why is it that the Hikurangi flood scheme is the only rate targeted to farmers in Northland area, when it is a major improvement for the whole of Whangarei area with jobs and improved land value creating more rates for the council.

The scheme is owned by the WDC who use the deprecation and value of scheme on WDC balance sheet (30 Million)

Farmers don't own scheme but pay the council \$138,000 to oversee it which it increased by 38 % in last 4 years. At an hourly rate of \$ 160, It's hard to believe they spend 16.5 hrs per week on the scheme. Asked for a breakdown but haven't received it yet

We are charged interest on the scheme but when it was in credit no interest was paid into it, can't believe we are charged interest on a scheme that we don't own.

All these issues need to be resolved as the poor long-term direction will rate us off the land.

Every time the rates go up the value of our land goes down rates cannot become another MORTGAGE

## **Creative Northland Respons**

The Whangarei District Council plans have been a great resource and we agree with the basis of the proposal changes and would like to comment further on the future advancement of cultural and economic wellbeing for the creative sector in the Whangarei District.

- Creative Northland acknowledges Whangarei District Councils (WDC) adoption of He Rautaki Toi ā
  Rohe ō Whangārei a strategy for arts, culture and heritage in the Whangārei District 2019–2029 which
  represents the combined vision of Creative Northland, Whangārei. District Council and the Creative
  Community.
- COVID19 has shown us that Cultural and Creative Wellbeing are an essential service for many of
  our communities mental and social wellbeing. There is an opportunity to reflect this in local
  government planning for a crisis of this nature and how the creative sector cross pollinates with
  other essential services and create good cultural policy to improve the accessibility to the arts and
  creative activities that promote artistic endeavours.
- 3. Like many parts of the community, the arts sector has been significantly impacted by COVID-19. Without access to venues or the ability to gather, many artists and arts practitioners are without a way to make or present their work, and without income a similar position to that of many people in your community.
- 4. Although the easing of restrictions at Level 2 will enable many council-owned arts and culture facilities (such as museums, galleries and libraries) to re-open, the restrictions on gatherings, and the need for people to physically distance from one another means that many artists and arts organisations will still be precluded from delivering their work, or required to deliver work to significantly reduced audiences.
- 5. The creative sector is an essential part of creating vibrant, cohesive and prosperous communities. It also plays a key role in supporting councils to promote the cultural and social wellbeing of their communities, as required under the Local Government Act 2002.
- 6. Continuing to support and ensure access to the arts and arts activities in the recovery from COVID-19 are ways to ensure that communities stay connected, learn and stay active all ways to take care of our communities' health and wellbeing.
- 7. The implementation of the WDCs Arts, Culture and Heritage prepares the ground for a Creative Wellbeing Strategy that identifies areas where culture and creativity are an essential service to ensure that communities continue to nurture their cultural and social wellbeing
- 8. As you consider your response to COVID-19, particularly during the recovery phase, actively involving people from the creative sector can ensure the plans you make are strategic, innovative, and meet the needs of your community.



- 9. During Covid Creative Northland supported the community through various online initiatives that fostered a digital space for creatives to communicate, connect and begin discussions of greater collaboration. The online/digital/ platforms worked as a space for empathy, acknowledgement of diversity and understanding for a wide audience who previously may not have felt as if their creativity could be so uplifting or carry such a powerful voice that speaks louder and more positively than we can describe/ understand.
- 10. Creative Northland will continue to provide forums for artists and creatives to share their ideas and be heard, provide financial assistance when we can, commission small works, ensure continued support for community-led activity, support community spaces, and create clear channels for communication will help our arts community remain connected and supported in their wellbeing and that of our communities.
- 11. It will also help us to ensure that our city, town or district remains vibrant, prosperous and a great place to live.
- 12. Ideally there is a piece of advocacy work to be undertaken that would serve to strengthen our roles in our creative communities that may not have been previously present, alongside supporting the arts sector, and it can become another element in the development of a more formal working relationship between WDC and Creative Northland

#### In response: 6. Rent relief for commercial and community tenants:

- 13. WDC to consider a support package for commercial tenants facing a 50 per cent loss of revenue, comprising several components that provide immediate relief to tenants so they could continue to meet their contractual obligations to landlords.
- 14. The government has provided good support for business, however there needs to be support for ongoing occupation costs otherwise many Whangarei businesses will become insolvent through Level 2 to Level 1 resulting in high levels of unemployment and welfare liability to the taxpayer.

#### Forward planning starts now:

- 15. Creative Northland wants to work with the council to bring vacant space alive and active on a temporary basis by making rent-free sites available to people who have community-focused and entrepreneurial project ideas, allowing innovators to test their ideas in a low-stakes setting and offering low-cost options short term for such an outcome to provide temporary activation is one solution.
- 16. Having the opportunity to be granted access to untenanted spaces on a temporary basis would allow us to work with start-ups and innovators to have an opportunity to trial and grow their idea while the building owners seek a suitable commercial tenant.
- 17. As per Christchurch City Council's plans, they created a new rates rebate scheme which is one mechanism designed to make untenanted spaces a practical option for landowners. This is a one-year trial that grants a rates rebate to owners who make untenanted spaces available for temporary use by licensing them to a trust/non for profit limited liability.



18. The entity would work to broker spaces, arrange insurances, curate projects, and support landowners, support art installations, small business start-ups, food trucks, and temporary gardens, building stronger and better connections with business and community eg. JobLab with NorthChamber.

#### **Council owned and operated venues**

- 19. We have made the assumption that Council is following the <u>Local Government Response Unit's</u> <u>guidelines for council services and operations at alert level 2</u> when reopening council owned arts and culture facilities such as libraries, galleries, museums and community halls.
- 20. Any leased premises to an arts organisation, group or artist, remain in contact with those tenants to understand how they're able to use the premises (or not) as alert levels change, consider what options you might have available to provide financial assistance.
- 21. Consider the example of post-earthquake Christchurch and whether WDC can make public space available to artists, and ease consent and licensing requirements, to support the delivery of unique, creative, community-delivered projects.
- 22. Use the COVID-19 crisis as an opportunity to encourage our art museum staff to think strategically about what they want their institution to look like in the future, and how they can build their resilience to any future emergencies. Use the opportunity to think about how the institution could better reflect the stories of tangata whenua.

#### **Council's own funding programmes**

- 23. Where possible, Creative Northland encourages councils to avoid reducing the funding they make available to cultural institutions (including museums, galleries and libraries) and for arts organisations and artists to apply for<sup>1</sup>.
- 24. This is important for helping your arts community to recover from COVID-19, while also ensuring that some of the council's expenditure continues to deliver cultural wellbeing outcomes for the community.
- 25. Consider whether WDC can divert money that would otherwise have been spent on an arts event or project that is no longer viable into your funding programmes that artists are able to access.
- 26. You could, for example, consider allocating this money as additional Creative Communities Scheme funding with mechanisms already in place to allow for that process. By doing so, WDC can ensure that its expenditure continues to deliver cultural wellbeing outcomes.
- 27. Be aware that some of the smaller arts organisations our community are struggling to meet basic costs such as rent and utilities costs. Consider whether any un-allocated arts or community funding could be made available to support meeting those costs.

- The rates increase should be zero, and in future the increase should only be at the rate of the CPI (not the arbitrarily designed LGCI) This insidious index overlooks the fact that the large number of people on fixed incomes, which are only adjusted either by reference to the average wage, or the CPI, have their fixed income eroded by the application of the LGCI. The use of this index needs to stop.
- The Council should abandon the plan to build new offices. The millions that would free up would allow all the core Council functions and services to still be carried out. The building is not needed staff losses mean the requirement for space has changed. As per Northern Advocate 29 April "Based on the staff numbers we have now, there will be fewer employees in 12 months," Whangārei District Council (WDC) chief executive Rob Forlong said. "We now have a sinking lid policy, with staff who leave not being replaced. Whilst I can't predict the future and how bad things are going to become, from what I know now, I am not expecting to have redundancies in the short to medium term."
- The parking fees, just increased in the CBD should become 'no fees'. Anecdotal comments I have heard: with the free parking during Level 3 more people were in the CBD surely that is what is required so make it happen.
- Hundertwasser building: the LTP should be modified to include that, under no circumstances whatsoever should the Council underwrite operating costs.
