Purpose

Discuss, Agree, Record

Ways in which tangata whenua
may participate in resource
management and decision
making processes under the RMA

Ways in which Council will comply
with statutory duties under the RMA

Not simply limited to participation or
consultation without decision making

Must record agreement about how hapu:

- Can participate in plan change preparation
- Will be consulted
- Can participate in streamlined or collaborative plan change processes
- Will be accommodated in hearing process



Must record agreement about how parties:

- Work together to develop and agree on RMA monitoring methods
- Give effect to iwi participation legislation
- Manage conflicts of interest
- Resolve disputes





Resource consents:

- How consultation or notification will occur
- Circumstances when hapu are given limited notification as an affected party
- How data sharing will occur
- Other functions, duties or powers
- How collective agreements may work
- Iwi authority delegation

Treaty Settlement

Mana Wakahono Agreements:

- Are not redress
- Do not limit any relevant provision of any iwi participation legislation
- Provide an opportunity to discuss various treaty settlement mechanisms

Patuharakeke Iwi Trust Board Application

- Application received 22 September 2017
- Drafting hui have been completed
- Legal review by both parties has been completed

Plan Changes



- Early engagement, including notification of intention to prepare a change to the plan
- Detailed process of PC drafting and the method of taking into account the PTB HEMP
- Hearings to be held on Marae at guidance of PTB
Consideration to appointment of commissioner with tikanga Maori and perspectives of local hapu
- Council to financially assist hapu members to train as RMA commissioners

Resource Consents

- Council will consider engaging PTB as a affected person or limited notification where a resource consent application is made that is not publicly notified and falls within the PTB rohe.
- Early service of electronic copies of all publicly notified resource consent applications.
- Council will seek the view of PTB as to whether PTB wishes to provide a Cultural Impact Assessment ("CIA") for Publicly notified within the rohe of PTB.
- Council will work towards an electronic information source or portal to enable PTB efficient access to data.



Monitoring

- Engagement of PTB in regard to monitoring methods under s30 of the RMA.
- PTB will prioritise the importance as hapu to determine methods to measure the state, changes and rate of the evolving environment.
- Council will incorporate the Matauranga of Patuharakeke into the selected monitoring method.
- The parties will work together (and with any other party) to remedy and restore any area so affected including next steps to minimise further non-compliance.
