2. Reports

2.1 2022 Elections – Māori Representation

Council's Electoral Officer, Dale Ofsoske ran through the presentation with Elected Members.

Elected Member questions and discussion

 If Council resolves to hold a poll on the establishment of Māori wards, and the poll is lost, would that apply for the following two election cycles? Dale Ofsoske –

- legislation provides that the outcome of a poll is binding for two triennium elections.
- Could a poll on the establishment of Māori wards be combined with a poll on the electoral system? Dale Ofsoske - this can be done, as long as this is within the timeframes.
- If Council resolves not to establish Māori wards and the public raises a poll, would this overturn Council's decision? Dale Ofsoske confirmed this would be the case.
- If two Māori wards were established, how would the other positions be redistributed? Dale Ofsoske - if Council resolved to implement Māori wards for the 2022 / 2025 triennium elections, a representation review would be triggered where representation could be considered in toto.
- Are there good examples of how options have been put out to communities? Dale
 Ofsoske Council must be neutral and factual in getting information out to
 communities, information is approved by the DIA first to avoid a look of bias.
