#### Purpose

To oversee the management of council's infrastructural assets, utility services and public facilities.

#### **Key responsibilities**

- Services including the provision, maintenance and capital investment for:
  - o Infrastructure asset management, projects and support
  - Infrastructure project co ordination
  - Transportation
  - Waste and drainage
  - o Solid waste, waste minimisation and recycling services
  - $\circ$  Water
  - Parks and reserves
  - Cemetery
  - o Laboratory services
  - Flood alleviation schemes
- Reporting on service delivery, including operational financial performance.
- Reporting on capital projects.
- Operational reporting for the Infrastructure group within Council.

- Procurement general procurement relating to the areas of business of this committee, within delegations.
- Shared Services investigate opportunities for Shared Services for recommendation to council.
- Council Controlled Organisations (CCOs) monitoring the financial and non-financial performance of CCOs whose functions would otherwise fall under the scope of this committee. Includes trading CCOs (CCTOs) and those CCOs exempted under the LGA. Responsibilities include:
  - o advising on the content of annual Statement of Expectations to CCOs
  - o agreement of the Statement of Intent
  - o monitoring against the Statement of Intent
  - for exempted CCOs, monitoring and reporting as agreed between Council and the organisation

#### CCOs accountable to this committee:

- Northland Regional Landfill Limited Partnership (NRLLP) CCTO
- Whangarei Waste Limited (WWL) exempted CCO

#### Delegations

- (i) All powers necessary to perform the committee's responsibilities, including, but not limited to:
  - a) the approval of expenditure of less than \$20 million plus GST.
  - b) approval of a submission to an external body.
  - c) establishment of working parties or steering groups.
  - d) adoption of strategies and policies relating to the key responsibilities of this committee (except for those that cannot be delegated by Council under Clause 32(1)(f) of Schedule 7 of the LGA).
  - e) power to establish subcommittees and to delegate their powers to that subcommittee.
  - f) the power to adopt the Special Consultative Procedure provided for in Section 83 to 88 of the LGA in respect of matters under its jurisdiction (this allows for setting of fees and bylaw making processes up to but not including adoption).
  - g) the power to delegate any of its powers to any joint committee established for any relevant purpose under clause 32, Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002.



## 4.2 COVID- 19 Whangarei Shovel Ready Programme

#### 1 Purpose

To approve the funding agreements with the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE), to receive a total of \$16M of funding for the Port Rd Intersection Upgrade and Shared Paths in Urban Whangarei.

### 2 Recommendation

That the Infrastructure Committee:

- 1. Approve Council entering into an agreement with the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment to receive \$10M of funding to be used for the construction of the new Port Rd Bridge and the upgrade of the Port / Kioreroa Rd intersection.
- 2. Approve Council entering into an agreement with the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment to receive \$6M of funding to be used for the construction of the Active Modes Urban Shared Paths Programme, including Tikipunga, Kensington and Raumanga shared paths.
- 3. Delegates to the Chief Executive the authority to finalise the terms and conditions of the agreements in recommendations 1 and 2

#### 3 Background

In Budget 2020, Cabinet agreed to provide a \$3 billion investment in infrastructure to support New Zealand's economic recovery as part of the 11 May COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund. The Government established the Infrastructure Reference Group (IRG) to identify a pipeline of shovel-ready projects to support the economy during the COVID-19 rebuild. This process was supported by Crown Infrastructure Partners.

The required outcomes of these Projects that align with the Funding criteria include: (a) new employment, the preservation of jobs and the redeployment of workers in communities and within the infrastructure sector hit by COVID-19; and (b) investment toward a more productive, sustainable and inclusive economy, enabling our regions to grow and support a modern and connected New Zealand.

On the 17 August Council received confirmation that up to \$16M had been announced for Shovel Ready Roading infrastructure projects in Whangarei. Two specific projects have been

approved from this funding, the Port / Kioreroa Rd Intersection upgrade and further funding for Council's Active Modes Urban shared paths programme.

#### 4 Discussion

#### 4.1 Port/Kioreroa Intersection Upgrade

Council initially applied for \$16Million for the Port/Kioreroa Intersection upgrade project from the Shovel Ready Fund. This is an existing project that was in Council current LTP but not funded until 2026. The project involves the construction of a new 2 lane bridge, widening the roadway to 4 lanes and the upgrade of the Port and Kioreroa intersection possibly involving a new roundabout.

Funding for the project from the Shovel ready fund has been capped at \$10Million, which will be sufficient for stage 1 of the project. Stage 1 includes the construction of the new bridge and the 4 lane road widening.

Council has applied to NZTA as part of the 2021-31 LTP Roading programme for a further \$6Million for stage 2 of this project to be funded in 2020/21. Stage 2 includes the Port / Kioreroa Rd intersection upgrade. If this funding is approved the intention would be to complete both stages as one project. This project will assist to open up the Port Nikau development, thus enabling additional housing and other developments.

#### 4.2 Active Modes Urban Shared Path Programme

Council initially applied for 5 projects from the Shovel Ready Fund, totalling \$40Million, to extend the current Urban Shared Path programme and provide new pedestrian footpaths in the District. All of these projects have been identified in Council's Walking & Cycling Strategy.

6.	In order to maintain legal professional privilege. {Section 2(g)}.
7.	To enable the council to carry on without prejudice or disadvantage, negotiations {Section 7(2)(i)}.
