Workshops with I&S, Monitoring and Resource Consents Departments. Research & Workshops with I&S, Monitoring and Resource Consents Departments. Research other Council approaches – Far North, Kaipara, Auckland, Thames Coromandel and Queenstown Lakes. Draft section 32 Evaluation Report and recommended provisions. Comprehensive internal and legal review completed. We are here – seeking Te Karearea views prior to consultation with general public. One month for stakeholders and the general public to make comment. Make necessary amendments to s32 and draft provisions. Report back to Planning Committee re consultation feedback and seek approval for public notification.

Existing Provisions

- Chapters 14 Objectives & policies.
- Chapter 59 Rules for trimming, removal and works within dripline.
- ➤ Appendix 2 Schedule of Heritage Trees scored using Standard Tree Evaluation Method (STEMTM).
- Appendix 2 General tree protection note for trees over certain size in road reserve or reserves administered by Council.



Internal Feedback

- Cost of resource consents.
- Transparency of blanket Resource Consent.
- Appropriate Balance between protection and allowing necessary works.
- ➤ No issue with current STEMTM criteria.
- Difficulty in monitoring and compliance.
- Misconception associated with the term "Heritage Tree".

Other Councils' Approach

- Variation in approaches taken.
- Majority of Councils researched use STEMTM.
- Some have one overall chapter, others have multiple chapters.
- Most have general protection of public trees.
- Greater use of non-statutory tree strategies in some Councils.

Notable & Public Trees

 \Diamond

Existing

 Provisions only for Heritage Trees (which include public trees via note in Appendix 2)

Proposed

- Separate provisions for Notable Trees and public trees.
- Greater protection for Notable Trees.
- Allowance for more works for public trees.

What is a Notable Tree?

Existing


- Referred to as "Heritage Trees". Trees listed in Appendix 2.
- Scored using criteria in Schedule 14A, derived from STEMTM.
- Trees scoring 100+ points are heritage trees in Appendix 2.

Proposed

- "Heritage Tree" becomes "Notable Tree".
- Refer solely to STEM[™] for criteria and scoring.
- Keep 100+ score requirement.
- Retain existing Schedule in Appendix 2.
- Public can make submissions to add / remove trees from the schedule during notification.



















Assessment Criteria

Existing

No assessment criteria for discretionary RC applications.

Proposed

- Assessment criteria for discretionary RC applications to guide applicants / decision makers.
- Consequential changes to matters of control and assessment criteria for subdivision to require consideration of the protection of existing trees.

Next Steps

- Incorporate any feedback from Te Karearea.
- Allow one month for stakeholders and the general public to make comment.
- Collate public feedback, amend section 32 and provisions as necessary.
- Present PC129 to Planning Committee for approval for public notification.

Objectives

- Provide overview on potential establishment of Māori wards
- Obtain general guidance



Key Issues

- Māori wards
 - iwi consultation
 - criteria
 - decision by 23 November 2017



- Establishment optional
- Legal obligations
 - LGA sec 4 Treaty of Waitangi: '...to maintain and improve opportunities for Māori to contribute to local government decision-making processes...'
 - LGA sec 14(d) 'a local authority should provide opportunities for Māori to contribute to decisionmaking'
 - RMA changes iwi participate in resource management and decision-making processes under the Act



- Consult with iwi
 - do iwi want Māori wards?
 - are there other options preferred?
 - Māori Standing Committees
 - Iwi Partnership Models
 - Rotorua District Council/Te Arawa Partnership
 - Gisborne District Council
 - Taranaki Regional Council
 - Māori Statutory Board (Auckland only)



- Others with Māori wards/constituencies
 - Bay of Plenty Regional Council (2001)
 - Waikato Regional Council (2013)
 - Wairoa District Council (2019)



- If established, formula based on Māori and General electoral populations
 - if retain 13 members, 2 Māori, 11 general
- Criteria to establish
 - by Council resolution
 - result of public poll
 - poll called by Council
 - poll demanded by electors



- Council resolution
 - is optional
 - can resolve any time, but for 2019 election, made by 23 November 2017
 - takes effect for the 2019 & 2022 triennial elections
 - public notice required by 30 November 2017
 - in notice, right of 5% (2,892) electors to demand a poll



- Public poll
 - Council can resolve or public demand any time
 - for result of poll for 2019 elections
 - resolution required or public demand received by 21 February 2018
 - poll held by 21 May 2018
 - results binding for 2019 & 2022 elections
 - cost implication (\$90k + GST)
- · Other polls held



Timetable

- by 23 November 2017 resolution (if required)
- by 30 November 2017 –public notice (if required)
- by 21 February 2018 demand for poll/Council resolution for poll
- by 21 May 2018 poll concluded (if required)
