Why?	I object to a raise in rates of almost 50% over 10 years alongside rising water and wastewater charges. People's incomes are not increasing at the same rate and this will continue to put pressure on families and businesses in our region.

Key issue - Spaces for gathering (see page 24)	
Why?	Given we as a region have declared a climate emergency, I do not agree with building a new building at Oruku Landing given the projections for sea level rises. I think this is short-sighted and a misuse of funds to build anything new on this scale in an area that will be impacted by sea level rise. I fully support funding for Hihuaua (as an existing structure) and because the work they are doing deserves to be supported far more than they have received to date.

Why?	Climate change mitigation and waste minimisation should be the KEY focus of council, not trying to continue as 'business as usual' building new structures on borrowed money in areas that will be at risk. Planning and supporting communities who may need to retreat should be a key focus as we navigate this new, challenging time.

Why?	

Tell us what you think - any further comments on key issues or other points raised in the Consultation document:

o I want to see WDC implement strict regulations around tree-clearing, especially for subdivisions and have protection in place for heritage and 'well-established trees'. I was horrified to see the clearing that happened on Three Mile Bush Road, Kamo for the subvision there. I think this is a key area of focus, especially as council has declared a climate emergency. I cannot fathom how the destruction of these trees is allowed to continue.

o I'd like WDC to provide funding and support/expertise to help us establish a cycleway/shared path in Maungatāpere. We have almost nowhere for people to walk for recreation, and cannot use the main roads because they are all now state highways with endless logging trucks. Our nearest park is Barge Park. We need something here. There are several paper roads within the area that could be suitable for a cycleway, and perhaps

also access for horse-riders, dog-walkers and other leisure users.

o I want the council to start insisting that all subdivisions over a specific size donate some land for public use. Otherwise we will end up with a lot of places like Maungatāpere that keep expanding but have no land for playgrounds, public toilets etc.

o l'd like WDC to help identify a possible route and funding source for a cycleway access between Maungatāpere and Whangārei. It is currently unsafe to cycle from Maungatapere to town. A dedicated cycleway would be another recreation option for people to utilise and help attract visitors to our community.

o I'd like WDC to look at establishing walking trails on Maungatāpere Mountain, in consultation with local iwi.

o I'd like WDC to invest more in supporting pensioner housing and working with agencies to provide safe housing options for our community that so desperately need it.

o I'd like WDC to provide more parking in the inner city or park and ride options to utilise bus travel with EASY links to other areas.

o I'd like to see more support and development of outlying communities vs the CBD which has had significant investment over the years and seems to have changed very little or returned a lot on the investment. I would like to see land owners in the area do more to support businesses and revitalise the area without requiring large amounts of public money.

o I support the new animal shelter and hope that it will be built to above minimum standards. I would also like to see more support for rehoming animals and supporting animal welfare groups to desex and microchip animals - especially as this supports conservation work for pest control and kiwi / endangered birds.

o I'd like WDC to look at establishing more off-leash dog areas around the region and either increasing the size of, or building another, off-leash dog zone near Pohe Island as it is so

well utilised.

I would also like to see more on-leash walking tracks as many around the area are either kiwi zone, DOC land or not suitable for dog walking. Dog ownership is growing worldwide and I believe the number of dogs owned in the region will continue to climb, so please help owners do the right thing and provide safe, suitable walking tracks.

o I'd like WDC to look at establishing a horse-riding trail around the region. For example utilising the council land at the end of Pukeatua Rd. Horse riders contribute on average \$10k per horse to the economy annually and are constantly overlooked. As our community and region grows, there is more pressure on roads and recreation areas, meaning it becomes even more unsafe for horse riders.

Please provide either shared spaces with cycleways / walking tracks or specific 'equine only' spaces for recreational riding - be it on council land, paper roads or in partnership with private property. Equestrians can contribute by paying an annual fee and adhere to H&S regulations (wearing helmets, hi vis, etc). I believe it will be huge attraction for our area (just look at the property values and number of people who travel to locations such as Woodhill Forest).

with the other two options for the present population without
spending a lot of money on yet another theatre space.

I don't know whether the cause is climate change or just lack of keeping up with infrastructure resources, repairs and management but I think a good sum of money should be put into improving drainage especially around Whangarei and the town basin but in other areas also We don't want to see a huge flood wipe out all the structures around the Hatea including the new Hunterwasser Centre. A really good overhaul of drains, pipes and all the other accoutrements that go with keeping the city and surrounds dry and safe is needed and needed right now Every heavy rain event lately has caused massive damage and distress. Buses need to be used much more regularly to stop those terrible buildups of traffic at peak times. Promote commuter bus runs. Overhaul timetables. Educate drivers. Promote organic farming and home composting. Strongly encourage supermarkets, cafes etc (if not already doing so) to give unused perishable food to those who can make best use of it. Stop waste.

should be vastly improved at Okara.

I would like to make mention of the state of housing in the area and the number of people who, in no way, can get a home either rented or owned.

One area that should be looked at is pensioner housing. If people in large family homes could sell and be helped into a smaller (small) house on shared private/public basis it could free up houses for families to purchase. Maybe the houses could be 70% private and 30% Council owned.

I would like to request that funding of \$5m over the next 5 years for new-build pensioner housing be included in the LTP.

The Youth Advisory Group wishes to present our submission verbally at an LTP hearing on the 13 or 14 of April.

KEY ISSUE – HOW WILL WE PAY FOR WHAT WE NEED

The Youth Advisory Group supports Option1 – a rates increase of 6.5% for the 2021 – 2022 financial year.

We believe that the proposed increase is fair as Whangārei District needs a 'catch up' after COVID.

KEY ISSUE – SPACES FOR GATHERING

The Youth Advisory Group supports a hybrid of Option 1 and Option 2.

While we would like Council to allocate budget across all three sites (Oruku Landing Conference and Events Centre, Hīhīaua Cultural Centre, and existing facilities at Forum North), we believe that Oruku Landing should take precedence due to the economic benefit it would bring to Whangārei.

KEY ISSUE – CLIMATE CHANGE AND SUSTAINABILITY

The Youth Advisory Group supports option 2 - put \$7.4 million of new funding towards climate change mitigation, adaptation and waste minimisation.

We think that \$3.7 million is a low budget for our climate change and sustainability issues in Whangārei and that we need to expand the budget.

Research and learning more about our land and waters is important but we need to increase the funding so that there we can start taking action over the next10 years.

KEY ISSUE – REVITALISING OUR CITY CENTRE

The Youth Advisory Group supports option1 - spend \$13m to make improvements to James Street and John Street.

The main street of a city is a destination for visiting tourists, both Kiwis and international. A welcoming main street is currently what we're missing in Whangarei, it certainly will create an attractive city centre connecting our main streets and the waterfront Loop area. If we use our budget wisely, we can make a change to our city centre for the best. It will not only be beneficial for outside visitors but a pleasant place for our local residents to enjoy.

The Youth Advisory Group has 3 priorities that we want Council to consider when thinking about how the Long Term Plan 2021-31 impacts the youth of today and on future generations:

- Priority One: Safer public spaces and places at all times.
- Priority Two: Having more to do in town during the day and at night.
- Priority Three: Reducing the barriers to participation for all youth.

KEY ISSUE: Revitalising our city centre

As part of the revitalization of the city centre, the Youth Advisory Group would like to see the following included in Council's plan:

 Making spaces in the CBD feel safer, friendlier, more vibrant and more welcoming using simple ideas like lighting up an area by using LED fairy lights (for example, the tree under the white canopy in Cameron Street) and having dedicated spaces to hold markets.

- Encouraging more people to be out and about in the CBD at night by having lots of different activities to do that aren't just about going to clubs and bars.
- Creating shared spaces where youth can hang out.
- Dedicated spaces where traveling/seasonal events can be held. For example, a temporary ice rink in Winter.
- Revamping The Strand.
- Youth want more variety in town and would like entertainment activities like 10 pin bowling, the movies and mini golf kept central.
- Access to fee wi-fi in the city centre, this would mean that young people with no credit could get in touch with their parents/caregivers/family if they felt unsafe.

KEY ISSUE: TRANSPORT

The Youth Advisory Group would like to see the following included in council's plan regarding transport and roading:

- Provision for access to inexpensive public transport for youth. This could include ree or really cheap shuttle buses for areas where lots of people don't have cars.
- Encouraging Uber or similar companies to Whangarei taxi companies aren't reliable, and buses don't go where we need them too.
- Increasing and improving streetlighting.

KEY ISSUE: SPACES TO GATHER

The Youth Advisory Group would like Council to direct some funding towards a building that is specifically designed to be a youth centre.

OTHER

The Youth Advisory Group would also like to see provision in the Long Term Plan for:

• **Outdoor gym equipment** - More outdoor gym equipment strategically placed around the district to encourage more people to get fit and healthy. Some people

can't afford gym memberships and providing the equipment means that more people have the option to workout. The community gym equipment at the Hatea Loop should also be set up closer together as a circuit, in a space that is safe.

An outdoor gym will certainly be beneficial, not only for youth but all ages. Our current gym equipment along the Loop are good but have lots of limitations. There are well set up outdoors gyms all across the world that attract all ages to use regularly. It doesn't need to be fancy equipment, a lot of exercises can be done with two long parallel bars for dips, monkey bars and normal pull up bars with different heights. *(see below for examples)*



• *Improved youth engagement* - The group would like Council to consider engaging with young people on important topics by going into schools to present, educate and collect feedback from students. There hasn't been much engagement between the council and students regarding the Long Term Plan - this seemed like a perfect opportunity to get more students involved in sharing their voice as well as getting publicity for WDC.

We would like to thank Whangārei District Council for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Long term Plan 2021-31.

RE: Submission on Long Term Plan 2021-2031 (LTP)

Tena koutou katoa!

1. Thank you for the opportunity to present this submission on the draft LTP. Thank you also for all the hard work that you and WDC staff have put in for the Whangarei District (WD), including in preparing this excellent draft LTP; your public service is highly appreciated.

2. I would like to focus my submission on two issues: (i) the response to climate change; and (ii) the WDC's financial strategy. By way of background, I have over 40 years' experience in public financial management, both in New Zealand and overseas; a particular focus of my work has been fiscal risks. My submission is personal and does not necessarily reflect the views of any organization with which I am associated. I have not discussed the issues covered in this submission with any WDC staff.

Climate Change

3. In my view, it would be appropriate for the WDC to produce and publish annual assessments, including possible mitigation costs, of the implications for the WD of climate change, in particular but not only the rise in the sea level. These would be both for the WDC itself and for representative types of private property owners. At the moment, as far as I can tell, information available to WD residents and ratepayers on climate change effects is fragmented, not updated on a frequent and regular cycle, and not focused on the WD.

4. The publication of such assessments, and therefore the WDC's climate change fiscal risks, would help the WDC as well as WD residents and ratepayers to form views on these risks, which would in turn encourage the WDC to be prudent in managing them. Regular publication of its climate change fiscal risks by the WDC would be consistent with international standards of fiscal transparency.

5. The publication of such assessments would also assist private property owners to manage the risks of climate change. Some of the actions to mitigate these risks would be undertaken by them, and they need an authoritative and reputable source of information on which to make their decisions. Moreover, greater transparency of these risks would assist adjustment in the market for property, thereby helping to ensure that the WDC does not come under pressure to bail out property owners for poor investment decisions in the face of climate change.

Financial Strategy

6. My comments on the draft LTP's financial strategy are at a high level. I have not tried to assess individual assumptions, e.g. projected population growth and interest rates (although the Statistics Department's update tomorrow of sub-national population projections might reflect the falling birth rate and reducing net migration, and a reversion to historical levels of real interest rates could be appropriate in a 10-year perspective). Therefore, I am not presenting an alternative view but rather urging you to reflect on whether the draft financial strategy is sufficiently prudent.

- 7. On this basis, there are several aspects of the draft financial strategy with which I am particularly concerned:
- The intention to double the WDC's ratio of net debt to revenue between 2019/20 and 2030/31. Around the world, the focus of most governments, both central and local, during the next decade will be to reduce debt burdens that have increased sharply because of the pandemic. In this perspective, it would be a logical baseline for the WDC to reduce its debt burden to the 2019/20 ratio that applied before the pandemic.
- The draft financial strategy does not include a specific commitment to maintain the WDC's credit rating. It is not clear whether the net debt ceiling in the draft strategy is consistent with this rating. A high credit rating is important not only to keep interest costs down, but also as an indicator of financial prudence assessed by experienced and expert independent rating agencies. In this regard, the draft financial strategy does not explain why it is necessary for the WDC to keep debt at a prudent level; such an explanation belongs in every government financial strategy document released to the public.
- Intergenerational equity can be a misleading justification for financing public investment with debt. We do not have perfect foresight, and so we cannot be sure that investment projects will deliver the expected benefits at the expected costs, and that future residents and ratepayers will value the benefits at the same level as current residents and ratepayers. From this perspective, public sector investment projects should be financed in large part from equity, because this aligns incentives and risk-taking i.e. current residents and ratepayers are making the judgements about the costs, benefits and risks, and so their equity should be substantially at risk.
- An excessive proportion of the intended funding for WDC new projects is from additional debt. However, I do not have a precise view as to what the right proportion should be. Of course, proposing to increase rates revenue further to fund a higher proportion of the cost of new projects would attract greater scrutiny from ratepayers, but that is the point.
- The draft financial strategy's discussion of fiscal risks understates them and does not quantify the WDC's ability to respond to their materialization. During the last 13 years, there have been 3 major economic shocks to New Zealand relating to: the global financial crisis, the Christchurch earthquakes and the pandemic. To assume that there will not be at least one more major economic shock during the period of the LTP seems to me somewhat optimistic. This is, of course, an important reason for prudence in debt levels. It is good practice internationally for governments to quantify with specific measures how they would respond to the materialization of fiscal risks.
- The draft LTP partly justifies the Oruku Landing Conference and Events Centre project on the availability of a large grant from central government from the COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund. This Fund has a macroeconomic perspective i.e. to support the recovery in aggregate demand following the economic shock caused by the pandemic. Governments around the world have a perennial problem of ensuring that projects funded in this context would have been priorities for funding in due course in the normal course of events. It is important that the Oruku project stacks up on its merits; WD residents and ratepayers also pay central government taxes and so have an interest in ensuring that the Fund is spent wisely. Moreover, the costs to the WDC proposed to be funded largely by debt would be significant, as would the risks with the WDC bearing all cost escalations.

8. My request is therefore for you to ask WDC staff to revisit whether the draft financial strategy associated with the draft LTP is sufficiently prudent. I hope that my submission will assist you to focus on some of the key issues in this regard. It would also be good if the final version of the LTP addressed the issues I have raised in this submission.
