<u>I DO WISH</u> for this submission to be kept on record, so that if a noise mitigation request needs be put in place for our home in Reotahi, this letter signals our concerns.

<u>Submission</u>: Adoption of the District Noise Standard and its effects on the local community (in particular, Reotahi residents.)

#### Preface:

We understand that the purpose of the Port's Noise Standard Appeal is so that they are more consistent with the rest of New Zealand and can better provide for port growth, whilst providing greater long-term certainty for residents and landowners who may be affected by port noise, now and in the future.

We know that they try to use best practise noise management in all parts of its operation, We acknowledge that in the past, they have been responsive to any noise complaints we make, especially at night.

#### **Our concerns:**

We are concerned at the Port's submission wording in their appeal 'to amend the permitted noise levels emitting from the Port zone." The mooted noise mitigation measures offered, imply that as the port expands, this gives the port authority carte blanche to make as much noise as they like, day and night.
 Under Section 16 Resource Management Act., noise emissions must be to a

reasonable level. There is also such a thing as nuisance factor of noise.

#### 2) Whining noise

Our major worry is the high whine of some cranes on the boats and the related generator deep throb that results from the generators taking the load. And also, it appears to be

particularly bad with large container ships, whose generators can throb like this all night in fact, for several days. Presumably this is because of refrigeration requirements? **This alarms us, if more container ships are to berth, which is in the Port's future plan**. These boats always appear to be unloaded at the Eastern end of the wharf, which is closest to our home. Arguably, the future port extension at the eastern end of the wharf will exacerbate this even more for homes in Reotahi. **Even if the permitted decibel levels are not reached, this can be regarded as a nuisance factor. Ref Section 16 Resource Management Act.** 

#### 3) Noise level monitoring.

To equate noise level emissions as equivalent to an electric toothbrush seems extraordinary.

- Did they take their noise levels over a number of weeks and average the level out?

- Did they take weeks that truly reflected all the changing activities at the port? Eg:-

-Wind direction and sea state (a light southerly at night when sound bangs boom across to Reotahi)

-Number of boats being loaded, or unloaded at any time. Three boats at once generate a great deal of 'nuisance noise'

- Type of cargo boat – log, chip, container

#### 4) Noise mitigation

-Will this be automatic for those inside the noise zone as indicated on the maps, or will we have to fight for our right to this? If so, will the system to do this be transparent and equitable for all?

As a whanau, Hihiaua is a place that we can celebrate events together, strengthen connections within our communities, perform and be celebrated for our abilities (my partner is a weaver and has demonstrated her artform in workshops and exhibitions, my daughters have performed kapa haka and violin within it's walls, my artwork has been shown in the gallery). On a business level, Hihiaua has provided an income for my small business "Real Choice Foods" - I have provided catering for many of their functions and because of this my business has expanded outside in to the greater community. My family is more financially secure and cared for because Hihiaua exists and has provided me with opportunities in the world. On a community level, Hihiaua is incredibly welcoming and open to anyone to be embraced and shown manaakitanga. The carving shed, led by Te Warihi Hetaraka is a treasure for our community. A treasure of knowledge and the language of whakairo that provides a carved language of our whakapapa, history and place in the world. This facility enables whakairo to be present in Te Taitokerau again through our many marae, wahi tapu and places of significance. The placement next to the Hatea is a significant connection to awa and moana, strengthening our community connection to our environment. The water is enabled to be enlivened with the presence of carved waka and the skills of kaihoe. Hihiaua promotes community working together as one towards common goals.....where else does this happen so powerfully in

Whangarei?

On a world wide level, Hihiaua is a leader. It is a place that brings the Maori world to the world for anyone who wants to access this. When we get beyond the covid threat and world travel is happening again, this centre is a major drawcard for those who want to see and be with authenticity of cultural expression.

So, my question to the council is, why have you only allocated \$5million to Hihiaua in your plan?

Hihiaua has been an entity for the past 30

years.....continuously, patiently, concertedly waiting for council to really back and support this living entity of expression of our local people.

I do not at all support the Oruku Convention Centre. None of the value that I have mentioned above is present in this project. It is an empty promise that I see having little worth for our local people or community. I am extremely concerned that as rate payers we carry the risk of the centre not being financially viable. And that we would be carrying a 23 million cost, 3 million per year and depreciation costs for a venue that has no community alive behind it, and no proven outcomes?!! As a rate payer I totally do not support a private commercial venture being funded by the council. No way.

Govenment has dangled a giant 60 million golden carrot in front of us, but the risks and value return for our community just don't fit the concept. My plea to you as decision makers for our community is to send the golden carrot back and step up to really get in behind and support the Stage 2 development of Hihiaua.

Imagine the possibilities that can be created if yes, \$5 million is allocated to Hihiaua and then a further \$3 million per annum is also introduced. The community is already enlivened by what

exists at Hihiaua, the further Stage 2 project enables a larger
platform for larger gatherings, projects, education, performance
and arts projects. It is already designed as a multi purpose
facility - the architecture of Stage 1 has already been
acknowledged as first class. The designs and community

I have found this feedback process quite limiting and have essentially subverted it to express my own ideas. I appreciate the work that you have done on this and I genuinely feel that good souls are working on this proposal with the best of intentions.

The plans are not radical enough to provide me hope that we are going to make a transformation of any meaningful impact. The reason is that the form of social engineering employed by our modern local political system and proposed in the LTP causes community disengagement on a massive scale.

The LTP should be more than an attempt to lay out the shape of maintenance projects and the design of physical infrastructure, it should be an attempt (at least that) to greater community engagement in the mitigation of climate change, and the regeneration of both natural and social resources.

While I feel there are some in council who are indeed trying to find a way to greater community engagement (which is commendable) I feel that more creative and radical attempts are required.

Climate change is the most important issue of our lives. The time for radical action is now.

McLean Road sealing - this road should now be fully sealed

McLean Road is not fully sealed. It runs between South Road and Cove Road. There have been continually annual increases in new house builds in the Waipu catchment which has led to an ongoing increase in the traffic frequency on Mclean road - both to service new houses on the road and also as a through road for residents from Massey, Glenmohr and South roads. The increasing traffic has resulted in increased dust on the unsealed portion with a negative impact on residents. Council approval of the new builds should also lead to addressing the sealing of Mclean road.

The road is also on the school bus route and the unsealed portion creates a safety risk both from the quality of the road and the driving behavior of other drivers (driving in the middle of the road).

Maintenance - sealing the remaining portion of Mclean road would reduce the costs of maintaining this road in a safe condition, costs which will only increase as the traffic density continues to increase on it.

	Upon further research I feel that WDC has misrepresented the proposal from the Forum North Trust 2013 in Option 3. I think this should have presented both options of the Council or the Trust constructing the asset. It seems to me that all the Trust is asking from Council is the \$12M already included in the proposed rates and the \$10M set

aside for the Theatre in previous LTP. Therefore, it seems ridiculous to me not to present this much smaller investment as an option rather than scaring people off with \$55M in debt. Also the \$4M per annum in operational expenses is ridiculous given that even if we round the Trusts top figure of \$750,000PA up it would only cost \$1Mpa.

While I acknowledge that if the trust was expecting the full \$1Mpa to come from rates then it would make sense for the Council to have control of the asset, I don't believe this to be true as they have supporters and are suggesting a commercial model with support from Council to provide community events.

Again in my original submission the option above led me to feel I needed to pick one with option 1 being the closest to my desired outcome. However now I would like to change my submission.

I support funding of the hīhīaua cultural centre as well as the Council supporting the Forum North Trust 2013 with the \$12M for this LTP and the \$10M from previous LTP as well as some ongoing funding similar to the model proposed for the Northland Events Centre. I feel that it is important that the Trust retain control of the running of this asset as they have the passion, knowledge and support to do so.

Again I point out the fact that not enough information has been given to the public to make an informed decision. Finding full details on this project and the others has been like pulling teeth. I am having to make a decision based on assumption which is not ideal.

Oppose the Sandy Bay Seawall:

\$1.5 Million is proposed for a sea wall at Sandy Bay. on page 121 of the draft ltp 2021.I have a VERY strong opposition to this proposal.

There has been minimal consultation with public and beach users and not only feels incredibly out of touch with how the beach is most commonly used, it is also in conflict with the matter of climate change and sea level rise.

Oppose for the following reasons:

1. This seawall is not required, there has been several floods in the area and the natural ability of the coast to recover and minimize damage is evidence enough to support the National Coastal Policy Statements preference for no hard structures within the marine and coastal environment.

2. The seawall will cause irreversible damage to the coast and the bay, its ecosystem support services and amenity.

3. The seawall will cause damage to a surf break of regional significance, and this stance is supported by prior correspondence to Council from the New Zealand Surf Protection Society.

4. The Department of Conservation, a landowner at the site, has not provided permission to Council for the works.

The previous works completed by the Council at Sandy Bay resulted in works done without consent, and then erosion protection work being removed, wasting hundreds of thousands of ratepayer dollars. This will be a huge waste of ratepayer money, which only benefits a couple of bach residents. There is no justification for spending that kind of money on a solution that will not only detrimentally impact the beach's use as a surf break, but also makes no financial sense as the council gears up to deal with climate change and sea level rises.

The money would be better spent developing a surf lifesaving/surfrider clubrooms on Kitty Vane reserve with public toilets and showers, and then adding to and planting out the east facing dunes. This is more in keeping with the climate change policies of planned retreat, rather than spending loads of money on a structure that could very well be underwater in the future.

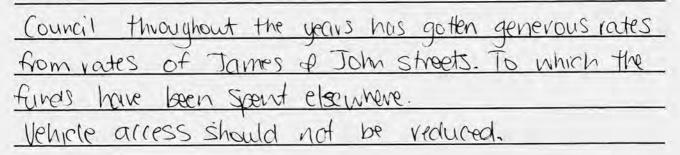

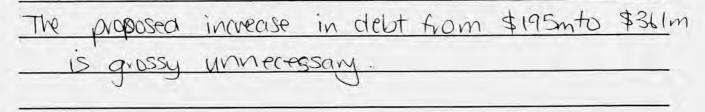

I strongly believe the council should start insisting that all big developments include an allocation of public land. Maungatāpere is a classic example of how things go wrong when this happens. We have had several subdivisions, but not one has offered public land because it's not a requirement. I look at new ones in Maunu, Three Mile Bush, and don't see anything there either. Corsair Drive has some covenanted bush, but it remains in private ownership and access is restricted to thirteen households. In the future, all our wider suburbs will end up ghettoes of housing with nowhere for our children to play, nowhere for desperate young mums to gather for free, and nowhere for passing travellers to pause to refresh themselves - and nowhere for a public toilet to be built, no matter how necessary this is seen to be. Council should be thinking ahead. It's cheaper to do the land allocation now than start trying to buy prime land years later - Maungatāpere's only hope now is for some kind resident to donate us some land but that's not really fair.

I am thankful for the support of Nicole Stanton and Jacki Cooper, and the council's push to get Maungatāpere to create a community group that will support and enhance our district. But we are limited in what we can do because of the lack of public land. I have had two daughters with new babies move into my street, and the lack of places for them to walk their babies or meet with other mums was a real frustration for them. They mostly drive to town and do the Loop, but that's a cost in petrol, and it's harder to manage around babies' sleeps. They really wanted to walk here, but there's nowhere. Does the council really want all of Whangarei doing its recreation in one place?

So my wishlist is for some public land to be found for toilets and a playground in

Maungatāpere, and then support for paper roads to be converted into cycleways/shared paths, plus bridle trails and dog-walking trails and mountain-bike trails to be built on the land at the end of Pukeatua Rd. And finally a cycleway so we can bike to town. I'd also love some footpaths and traffic-slowing devices in Maungatāpere, and traffic lights so we can cross the road without risking death, but unfortunately that's now all up to NZTA and they're not known for caring about the communities their roads pass through.

I love the recreation focus you have in town, but please don't ignore the suburbs and further out communities. We need our own recreation spaces.

There is something fundamentally wrong wth local people not being able to afford to live in the area they were brought up in.

WDC could strongly and actively encourage the establishment of eg trusts that build and then lease affordable homes and apartments to young families (100 year lease - the house has to be sold back to the trust when a family moves on ) in a similar way to mechanisms established by Queenstown to enable its employees to live in or close to that city.

I would like to see greater attention given to activities which affect and enhance a stronger local community; and retention of natural environmental features eg Ngunguru Sandspit.

Why?	Neither of these options. I disagree with the proposed rate increases. Rates should only increase by the amount of the LCGI and no more. The majority of ratepayers are constrained in their earning ability by the movement in the CGI that most employers use when reviewing wages annually, which is then reflected in their disposable income. WDC should also apply this logic. To reflect in the LTP that the increase is only small in \$ terms is ingenuous. These figures are based on rateable valuations set in 2019 and do not reflect the current trend in house/land valuations. The anticipated increase in these values should be included in any deliberations when setting forecasts for the LTP. These forecasts should be the basis for expenditure during the LTP.

Why?	Oruku Landing Conference and Events Centre
	I do not wish to see the WDC putting money into this proposal. WDC has already missed the boat when considering options for an Event Centre. This should have been built on the Whangarei

RSA site to a scale similar to the Bruce Mason Centre in Takapuna which can seat 1000, or even similar to the Vodafone Events Centre in Manukau or the Spark Arena in Downtown Auckland. The areas in Forum North identified as the Bougainville Theatre and the Exhibition Hall should then have been converted to office space without the need for a "purpose built" council facility.

The proposed size of the Events Centre will not provide the Whangarei District with a venue capable of hosting, under cover and seated, groups in excess of 750. This will still limit options for events that require larger numbers than that to attract entertainers or shows to the area. If we are to build an Events Centre then let's build one that will actually provide the community with a facility capable of hosting large numbers of spectators for major productions or concerts. Just because the Government will stump up a portion of the cost, this should not be given a priority consideration when making a decision. I

The other major issue with this site is that there is very limited parking in close vicinity to this site now that the carparks on the other side of the river have (or will be) converted to green space.

There are many options for conferences in the Whangarei District (some of which are listed below) so the perceived demand for extra conference facilities must be limited and in fact introducing another option will impact on these other venues.

Councils should also not be involved in commercial enterprises. To accept liability for cost-overruns and future management and maintenance of the facility places an unknown onus on present and future ratepayers. If this event/conference centre was such a viable proposition then private enterprise would build it. That they can get the public purse to stump up is just good business sense from their perspective but provides little back for ratepayers other that more debt to service. I also note that the proposal for the Hihiaua Cultural Centre also includes conference facilities and theatre.

That the council has to spend \$3m on operational expenses shows that such a facility is not financially viable; i.e. it won't pay its way. The proposed site is also in a Flood and Tsunami Zone and the proposal does not appear to provide protection from such an event, nor consider rising sea levels.

Funding for this should go ahead as planned providing it considers Tsunami protection and rising sea levels.

Forum North Building

Only minimal improvements should be made to this site once the council moves into its new edifice. Any consideration of using this site for a "Theatre" should be deferred until the next LTP cycle. The level of debt the council is proposing for capital type projects is too onerous over such a short term and projects need to be spread over a greater time-span. Council needs to remember that, while taking on debt to spread the cost of projects over future generations is correct, the cost to current ratepayers is actually higher than that borne by future generations. We can't just keep piling on debt for debt's sake. While council has placed a cap on what can be borrowed, that doesn't mean it has to borrow for what can only be deemed nice-to-have projects. There are many essential projects that are not being done because finances are having to be directed at servicing debt. Let's wait until some of the historical debt has been repaid before lumping more on to nice-to-have projects.

That submission requested a contribution, as seed funding towards the development of 1/3rd the cost of the \$6 Million dollar facility. WDC has provided written support for the project several times. Staff supported the project within their asset management plans by proposing a budget in the 2021 LTP for a public car park. Ruakaka Recreation Centre has since then secured \$2.5 Million seed funding from MBIE as a Crown Infrastructure Project (CIP). Northland Volleyball Association is now involved and building a Regional Volleyball Facility.

Statement from the Ruakaka Recreation Centre Committee.

The Committee has put significant resources and time into the proposal for a new Multi Use Recreation Centre and Regional Volleyball Arena. The project creates immediate employment opportunities during design and construction and the ongoing facility operations. The Facility will be located centrally in the village, as part of the wider sports, cultural and business precinct. It will provide for both the current and future needs of one of New Zealand's fastest growing areas, Bream Bay.

We request the Whangarei District Council budget \$1,000,000 within the 2021 - 2031 LTP for public car parking at Ruakaka Sports Park.

Reasons for this request:

Council and Ruakaka Recreation Centre have worked for many years to implement improvements to Ruakaka Recreation Ground, including new fields, skatepark and a new indoor facility, a carpark is missing to accommodate those improvements.

WDC is currently expanding the park use through 2 new football field developments,

increasing the park usage, traffic and parking issues.

Increased population growth, park use and park development requires additional car parks. A recent Traffic Impact Assessment determines an approximately 130 space car park at the reserve is necessary to support the increased park and facility use.

WDC road changes at Takutai Place, removed 20 car parks from the existing Recreation Centre site.

The informal parking on Sime Road is a health and safety concern.

A new community funded skatepark, valued at \$400,000 has been constructed with no carpark.

WDC, by contributing to this carpark would benefit from the completion of a mostly noncouncil funded facility, for the benefit of the people of Whangarei, creating employment, a public events space and sports hub, with regional sporting significance.

Partnership with the Northland Volleyball Association will see a Regional and National level volleyball and Beach Volleyball facility on the site, hosting tournaments and bringing visitors and economic benefit to Ruakaka.

The building provides for many community efficiencies in terms of replacing the need for both football and the local High School requiring further facilities. It takes a holistic approach to facility planning.

Public Car park: With community raising \$7Million to build a facility for community, Council ought to consider, as it has done elsewhere, the inclusion of public car parking at the Ruakaka Sports Park.

The Sports park has 2 new football fields being built by WDC and these fields require car parking and none is apparently planned for that development. Currently the RRC have less car parks than prior to the development of Takutai Place.

The image below shows the central location of the site to the town, the park and the school.

Submission item 2.

The RRC support the Northland Sports Coalition request for:

Funding for the implementation of the Whangarei Active Recreation and Sport Strategy – specifically a District Facility Navigator role.

Support for specific projects highlighted in the consultation document: the continuation of Pohe Island developments; Hikurangi Skatepark; upgrade of walking tracks; developing community sportsfields/hubs

That Council considers increasing the amount of funding available for active recreation and sport facilities through the contestable partnership fund – we believe an increase of funding should be available for key sport and recreation facilities

Further reasons for WDC support..

The Facility Project is underway and will require the public infrastructure to ensure full public access.

No other LTP community and sport project has the same area of benefit, support or governance structure in place. This is the project with the highest future demand and largest catchment.

Over 1,000 letters of support have been received for this project. The project is supported by Sport Northland, Northland Football Federation and many other organisations who seek to improve the lives of local people.

A feasibility Study is Complete

The project has Architects, engineers, planners and project management expertise already assigned.

A traffic Impact Assessment is completed.

The proven Governance Structure already exists

The Land is available and already leased.

Bream Bay is identified as an area of high growth, Council must plan and provide adequately for that growth.

The link between mental health, especially of youth, and a foundation of good exercise and social development is well known. Bream Bay youth require Councils assistance to provide these facilities for their benefit.

WDC has budgeted the development of land, currently leased by the RRC into sports fields prior to it developing a Reserve Management Plan as it is required to do within the

Reserves Act 1977. Such a process would identify priority needs for the community. Council has budgeted some \$800k towards field development.

The development of new fields still leave the Bream Bay football fraternity without a club facility. Development of the new building would enable the existing building to free up for use as a football building, near to the fields. Without this, Football could expect to spend a further \$1.5Million providing such a facility.

The WDC has identified several items in its "Interim Development Plan" the action items have been largely achieved by volunteers at Ruakaka.

RRC have fundraised and project managed facility development worth in excess of \$2.9 Million in the past few years.

The stakeholders have gained \$2.5Million in seed funding for stage 1, and had their

expression of interest accepted for stage 2 (\$5M) by lottery grants.

The project was set to employ many people during construction and increase FTE operational by 3FTE. Economic development in the Ruakaka area is important. Volleyball Northland and Volleyball New Zealand have partnered in the development to build and manage a National and regional beach/indoor volleyball facility. That over \$70,000 in volunteer and pro bono work has been completed to bring the plan to

its current viable stage.

Project Summary:

The Ruakaka Recreation Centre Committee and Volleyball Northland are helping local people in Bream Bay by providing a multi-purpose space for sports, cultural and community use at Bream Bays' first indoor sports hall and unique beach volleyball arena. The project is being done in 2 stages and stage 1 is underway now with the help of the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment, Shovel Ready grant.

Stage 1 is a modern community gym and wellbeing facility and will cost \$2.5 million. It is an easy access building on the Tiki Place Park, situated near to the new skatepark only 3 minutes walk from the High School, with its own easy parking.

The Ruakaka Recreation Centre Committee are excited about the new building, they have an old building now and it is too small. A new facility also frees up the existing centre for football, squash and other clubs.

Stage 1 is funded to \$2.5 Million from the Infrastructure Reference Group Covid19 Recovery Fund. The government's shovel ready fund has been amazing in getting the first stage of the project underway and will be a great investment of taxpayer money. The committee is grateful for the support from Government which recognises the specific growth and demand issues in Bream Bay. The committee aims to employ and upskill local people as much as possible and encourage knowledge and skills improvement, especially for the local youth. Stage 2 is a 2 court indoor sports hall, event space and beach volleyball arena, and will cost about \$5 Million to build. to support the people living here, this is an obvious opportunity. It connects the beach and the main shopping centre, surrounded by open space.

The people coming to Ruakaka need a place to gather for whatever reason, a place they feel welcomed and can meet the locals. A central area to meet the locals so that the stories of Ruakaka become those of our new neighbours, colleagues and team mates. A warm welcome assists the reputation of Ruakaka as a place to move to live, work and play. With all the development in Bream Bay, the area needs social infrastructure, It gives a sense of place.

There is huge potential in the new building to centralise a cultural precinct at Ruakaka. This is a once in a generation opportunity. As a multi purpose facility it's versatile so that Bream Bay will have a one stop shop for sport, leisure, clubs, trade shows or events.

The facility will be the first public indoor facility for many years, and as there is none planned in the draft LTP, the only one for a further 10 years, in the highest percentage population growth area in the district.

The facility is a Regionally Significant sports facility and is supported in the most recent Regional Sports strategy.

The facility therefore qualifies for funding from large scale third party funders, one of which would support up to 2/3rds of the total cost, depending on the seed funding being achieved.

The Project team are positive that the funding for the facility can be gained, the WDC, as the landowner and as the authority for the public access and use to the wider park has a vested interest in the development as it contributes to the outcomes within its 2021 - 2031 LTP.

A feasibility study is completed.

Public support has been gained.

Administrative and funding liaison positions are in place.

Governance and financial auditing requirements of third party funders are met.

Funding for stage 1 is secured to 2.5Million via MBIE

Design and Project Management Team Procured. Design workshops stage 1 and 2 advanced.

A mix of Community Facility and Regional Sports Arena:

The Northland Regional Volleyball Arena will share the site with the Community Sports Hall. 6 outdoor beach volleyball courts will be provided AND also available for community use via bookings. This compliments and brings greater access to sports to the local community.

The Community Recreation MultipurposeHall

For Foundation North consideration, the Community Recreation Hall (proposed as Stage 2) provides for 2 full sized Netball Courts indoors. This provides for existing demand, demand from the school and for community events. The Community Facility is designed to a scale which provides futureproofing to cater for the anticipated high population growth in Ruakaka.

Time and Cost Schedules

Time and cost for this project are managed in 2 stages: Stage 1 is the local wellbeing centre, stage 2 the Sports Hall. If funding is achieved in 2021 then stage 2 will begin concurrent with Stage 1, to provide overall efficiencies and contract effectiveness. Stage 1 is funded to 2.5Million via a government Shovel Ready Fund.

The remaining \$5 Million is anticipated to come from third party investments being applied for at present.

A brief History of the project over the past 4 years.

Pre 2017:Pre-planning, lease arrangements in place, user and demand profiles Sport and Stakeholder Liaison

2017:A thorough Feasibility Study (funded via Lotteries Grants) completed late 2017 provides the basis for project bulk costs as this sight prices from a likely construction partner and a Quantity Survey Check. The study showed the building was feasible. 2018- 2019 Since late 2017 the committee has been finalising contracts, leases, administration and governance and completing vital planning with the Whangarei District Council, the land owner.

In 2018 the committee made a submission to the WHangarei District Council requesting 1/3rd funding.

2020: Applications were made to funders and MBIE funding was successful. The committee developed the staged plan with professional input.

Procurement of design services was completed using Government best Practise and Social Procurement Guidelines. Project Director, planing and engineering contracts were procured for stage 1, with a view to possibly continue with those services through stage 2 if contracts met deliverables. NB: MBIE funding was not contracted until December 2020, unfortunately this left the timeframe between funding the professional services to develop resource consent with very tight timeframes.

2021: During early 2021 further professional services have been engaged for the design and engineering works.

Northland Volleyball Association is now involved and building a Regional Volleyball Facility.

#### Statement from the Ruakaka Recreation Centre Committee.

The Committee has put significant resources and time into the proposal for a new Multi Use Recreation Centre and Regional Volleyball Arena. The project creates immediate employment opportunities during design and construction and the ongoing facility operations. The Facility will be located centrally in the village, as part of the wider sports, cultural and business precinct. It will provide for both the current and future needs of one of New Zealand's fastest growing areas, Bream Bay.

The committee recognises and is grateful for the significant contribution from the Governments Shovel Ready fund. More than ever the wellbeing of our community is under pressure. We believe the investment in recreational health facilities provide lifelong benefits to all people.

The committee will provide accurate governance and project documentation. This project aligns well with wide recognition of Ruakaka as a High Growth Area with projects which boost the regional economy. The facility will be owned and managed by the RRC. #### Submission item 1.

# We request the Whangarei District Council budget \$1,000,000 within the 2021 - 2031 LTP for public car parking at Ruakaka Sports Park.

Reasons for this request:

- 1. Council and Ruakaka Recreation Centre have worked for many years to implement improvements to Ruakaka Recreation Ground, including new fields, skatepark and a new indoor facility, a carpark is missing to accommodate those improvements.
- 2. WDC is currently expanding the park use through 2 new football field developments, increasing the park usage, traffic and parking issues.
- 3. Increased population growth, park use and park development requires additional car parks. A recent Traffic Impact Assessment determines an approximately 130 space car park at the reserve is necessary to support the increased park and facility use.
- 4. WDC road changes at Takutai Place, removed 20 car parks from the existing Recreation Centre site.
- 5. The informal parking on Sime Road is a health and safety concern.
- 6. A new community funded skatepark, valued at \$400,000 has been constructed with no carpark.
- 7. WDC, by contributing to this carpark would benefit from the completion of a mostly non-council funded facility, for the benefit of the people of Whangarei, creating employment, a public events space and sports hub, with regional sporting significance.
- 8. Partnership with the Northland Volleyball Association will see a Regional and National level volleyball and Beach Volleyball facility on the site, hosting tournaments and bringing visitors and economic benefit to Ruakaka.
- 9. The building provides for many community efficiencies in terms of replacing the need for both football and the local High School requiring further facilities. It takes a holistic approach to facility planning.
- 10. Third party funders view Council contribution towards the project favourably.

**Public Car park:** With community raising \$7Million to build a facility for community, Council ought to consider, as it has done elsewhere, the inclusion of public car parking at the Ruakaka Sports Park. The Sports park has 2 new football fields being built by WDC and these fields require car parking and none is apparently planned for that development. Currently the RRC have **less car parks** than prior to the development of Takutai Place.

The image below shows the central location of the site to the town, the park and the school.



## Submission item 2.

#### The RRC support the Northland Sports Coalition request for:

- 1. Funding for the implementation of the Whangarei Active Recreation and Sport Strategy specifically a District Facility Navigator role.
- Support for specific projects highlighted in the consultation document: the continuation of Pohe Island developments; Hikurangi Skatepark; upgrade of walking tracks; developing community sportsfields/hubs
- 3. That Council considers increasing the amount of funding available for active recreation and sport facilities through the contestable partnership fund we believe an increase of funding should be available for key sport and recreation facilities

#### Further reasons for WDC support..

The Facility Project is underway and will require the public infrastructure to ensure full public access.

- 1. No other LTP community and sport project has the same area of benefit, support or governance structure in place. This is the project with the highest future demand and largest catchment.
- 2. Over 1,000 letters of support have been received for this project. The project is supported by Sport Northland, Northland Football Federation and many other organisations who seek to improve the lives of local people.
- 3. A feasibility Study is Complete
- 4. The project has Architects, engineers, planners and project management expertise already assigned.
- 5. A traffic Impact Assessment is completed.
- 6. The proven Governance Structure already exists
- 7. The Land is available and already leased.
- 8. Bream Bay is identified as an area of high growth, Council must plan and provide adequately for that growth.
- 9. The link between mental health, especially of youth, and a foundation of good exercise and social development is well known. Bream Bay youth require Councils assistance to provide these facilities for their benefit.
- 10. WDC has budgeted the development of land, currently leased by the RRC into sports fields prior to it developing a Reserve Management Plan as it is required to do within the Reserves Act 1977. Such a process would identify priority needs for the community. Council has budgeted some \$800k towards field development.
- 11. The development of new fields still leave the Bream Bay football fraternity without a club facility. Development of the new building would enable the existing building to free up for use as a football building, near to the fields. Without this, Football could expect to spend a further \$1.5Million providing such a facility.
- 12. The WDC has identified several items in its "Interim Development Plan" the action items have been largely achieved by volunteers at Ruakaka.
- 13. RRC have fundraised and project managed facility development worth in excess of \$2.9 Million in the past few years.
- 14. The stakeholders have gained \$2.5Million in seed funding for stage 1, and had their expression of interest accepted for stage 2 (\$5M) by lottery grants.
- 15. The project was set to employ many people during construction and increase FTE operational by 3FTE. Economic development in the Ruakaka area is important.
- 16. Volleyball Northland and Volleyball New Zealand have partnered in the development to build and manage a National and regional beach/indoor volleyball facility.
- 17. That over \$70,000 in volunteer and pro bono work has been completed to bring the plan to its current viable stage.

### **Project Summary:**

The Ruakaka Recreation Centre Committee and Volleyball Northland are helping local people in Bream Bay by providing a multi-purpose space for sports, cultural and community use at Bream Bays' first indoor sports hall and unique beach volleyball arena. The project is being done in 2 stages and stage 1 is underway now with the help of the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment, Shovel Ready grant.

Stage 1 is a modern community gym and wellbeing facility and will cost \$2.5 million. It is an easy access building on the Tiki Place Park, situated near to the new skatepark only 3 minutes walk from the High School, with its own easy parking.

The Ruakaka Recreation Centre Committee are excited about the new building, they have an old building now and it is too small. A new facility also frees up the existing centre for football, squash and other clubs.

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- 3. Develop Bream Bays first multi purpose Sports Hall.

#### **Key Stakeholders:**

The existing recreation centre users. Over 60s club. Bream Bay United Football Club Volleyball Northland Basketball Northland Northland Netball Association Bream Bay College Patuharakeke Trust Bream Bay Community Trust.

#### **Project Readiness:**

The facility has been planned for some time and is ready to move to construction as soon as the relevant local permits are provided.

The following Phase 1 work has already been completed:

- Integration with District Development Structural Plans.
- Inclusion in the Whangarei District Council, Recreation Strategy
- Stakeholders and funding agencies are engaged.
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- Design and Project Management Team Procured.
- Design workshops stage 1 and 2 advanced.

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The remaining \$5 Million is anticipated to come from third party investments being applied for at present.

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**Pre 2017:**Pre-planning, lease arrangements in place, user and demand profiles Sport and Stakeholder Liaison

**2017:** A thorough Feasibility Study (funded via Lotteries Grants) completed late 2017 provides the basis for project bulk costs as this sight prices from a likely construction partner and a Quantity Survey Check. The study showed the building was feasible.

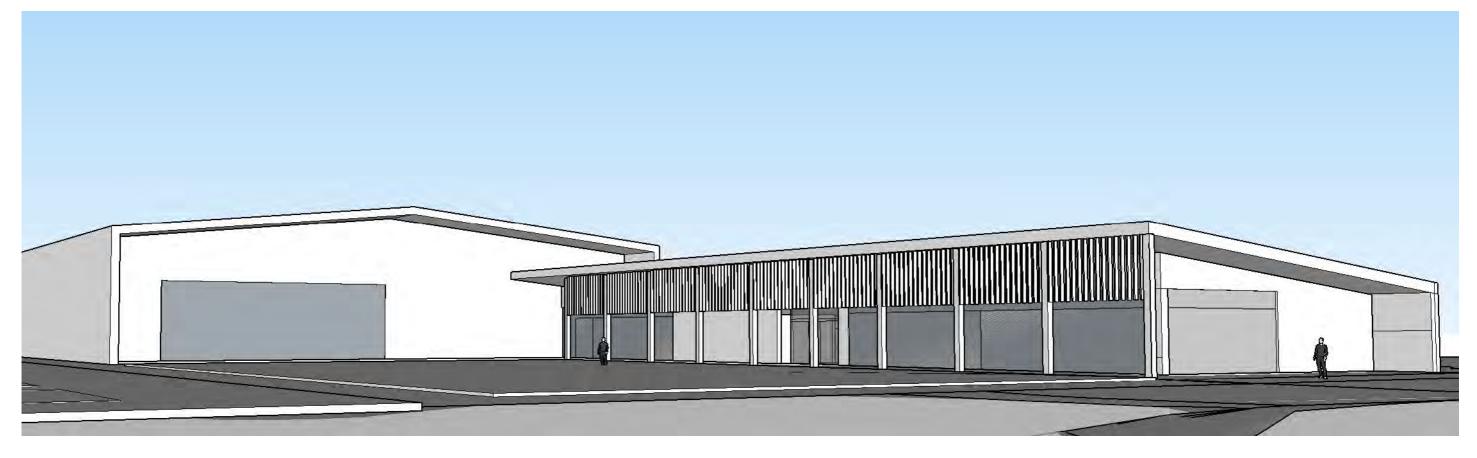
**2018- 2019** Since late 2017 the committee has been finalising contracts, leases, administration and governance and completing vital planning with the Whangarei District Council, the land owner.

3. The seawall will cause damage to a surfbreak of regional significance, and this stance is supported by prior correspondence to Council from the New Zealand Surf Protection Society.

4. The Department of Conservation, a landowner at the site, has not provided permission to Council for the works.

The previous works completed by the Council at Sandy Bay resulted in works done without consent, and then erosion protection work being removed, wasting hundreds of thousands of ratepayer dollars.

This Road is a through Road which carries a lot of heavy traffic from Mountfield Quarry from the North and Millbrook Quarry from the South.

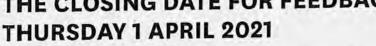
The Road is also used by the numerous lifestyle blocks on the western end of Mountfield Road.

During the week commencing 29.3.2021 Applecross Road has been graded. Roadside drains and water tables have been cleaned, a thick layer of gavel has been spread rolled and graded again. A culvert has been replaced. This is the maintenance that was urgently required and it is much appreciated. However regular grading in the future is required to keep the Road at a suitable standard.

I have noticed that other Roads in the Waipu District that I drive on and and that are not on the Council's resealing programme need the same major maintenance as Applecross Road has received. The Western end of Brooks Road is one such Road.

site as shown in the WDC gismaps under hazards: that area
has been classified as susceptible to flooding with the land

I do not beleive the WDC should be investing in a private investors business with the Oruku Landing area. This land was purchased privately by investors to build a 4 or 5 star hotel around the time the Hundertwasser referendum.

The Whangarei District Council Long Term Plan Section on Gathering Spaces has intentionally misled the public by presenting figures that are totally inaccurate. The Forum North Trust gave a presentation to the full Council on July 7th 2020

As I see it these are the facts:

1. The 850-seat theatre at forum north will NOT cost \$55 million dollars. Where did Council staff get that number? The theatre as presented has been quantity surveyed at \$35 million. I.e. approximately \$40,000 per seat compared with Oruku Landing at \$130,000 per seat.

2. The Trust has not asked Council for that huge amount of money - \$55 million. It wanted to access the \$10.4 million as identified in the long-term plan. It will raise the additional funds. It currently has a donation of \$1 million dollars for this project.

 The Council document states that the operational expenses will be \$4 million dollars...(that is a hug amount of many). The trust gave a net operating budget of between \$500,000 and \$750,000.

4. If Council did not fund Oruku landing, there would be NO rate increase for this longawaited project. It is ready to proceed now. It would not need to raise the rates by 4.4%.

The money already has been set aside.

5. Council paid \$100,000 to consultants to look at theatre options. It concluded that the Forum North Site was the best. It also stated that Council running of the facility would not be recommended as it was not part of their skills. The demise and continued decline of the Forum North Facilities give evidence to that fact.

6. The current Forum North Facilities have been allowed to run down due to Council neglect over the years. Regardless of what options are chosen these once magnificent community facilities require renovation and modernising. Council costings show \$12 million...far too much for what is required.

7. If Council funded the 850 seat Theatre at Forum North it would have a superb conference and events centre comprising a 750-seat flat floor area in Kotahitanga, 350 seat Capitaine Bougainville Theatre, and 850 seat performance theatre, Cafler Suites, Green Room, Rehearsal spaces, and most importantly 280 space car parking adjacent to it. The trust would seek to double that car parking space.

The Trust intends to develop the site into a performing arts precinct. One of the best in NZ. It would be a jobs and event generator. Not a passive box to be rented out as it is now.
 It would also be a training centre for the performing Arts.

9. A theatre at Forum North would generate much needed foot traffic in the CBD. The Oruku Landing project will take pedestrians away from the city centre.

10. As shown in the presentation to Council, an 850-seat theatre would be well supported by the largest touring performing arts groups in NZ.

11. The Forum North Theatre project has been a community supported initiative and backed by more than 3,000 members in various artistic groups. It was an open consultation and widely supported.

Oversized vechiles regularly use McLean Road as Cove Road bridge just east of Waipu village is to small.

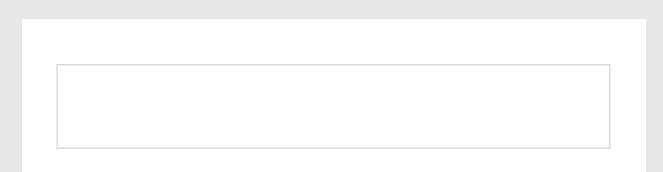
This is quite dangerous as they travel in total disregard of the McLean Road limits.

# Tell us what you think - any further comments on key issues or other points raised in the Consultation document:

The main issue I would like to address is that more money needs to be invested into

protecting native biodiversity across Whangarei. The WDC is the main landowner of green spaces across the city and more should be invested into reducing the threats to native biodiversity (e.g. sustained mammalian predator control). I am writing this submission on behalf of the Parihaka Community Landcare group and Tiakina Whangarei (an urban conservation project funded by the NRC; https://tiakinawhangarei.co.nz). Currently about 1/4 of the WDC owned parcels in Parihaka are under mammalian predator management with all the mahi being done by volunteers. Funding and support is received from various organisations (including the WDC); however, more is needed in order for the entire maunga to be under management.

I would like to propose that the WDC enters into discussions with key stakeholders in order to find the funds needed to get Parihaka completely under management. I have the support, in principle, from Tiakina Whangarei and Parihaka Community Landcare, and have discussed the idea with a Ngati Kahu spokesperson (who are kaitiaki for Parihaka), who is seeking feedback from the hapu. I have also costed out the project for the first year year period and can provide more detailed information on this, if required.

There would be many benefits to Whangarei if predator management occurs across all of Parihaka. Environmentally, native flora and fauna would flourish in the absence of mammalian predators. This has been noted already in the areas of Parihaka where management has been occurring since 2016. Furthermore, sustained predator control would allow us to translocation native species not seen in Whangarei for over 100 years (e.g. toutouwai/North Island robin and popokatea/whitehead). Socially, Whangarei residents would have an area of ecological significance within easy access. This would mean that the maunga would not just be a great place to walk (as it is at the moment), but a place where the community can engage and learn more about their local environment as there will simply be more biodiversity to see. This will improve our connections with the local environment and (as numerous research studies have shown), improve our wellbeing. Furthermore, the 'spillover' of wildlife for the ngahere into the city's residential area would allow people make even greater connections with nature (as seen in places like Wellington). Economically, this project would create some employment (ranger roles) and allow for residents to upskill in environmental management (through volunteering and the associated training opportunities). In addition, having an area so accessible to the CBD that is of high ecological value would be an asset that could be promoted to visitors.

As mentioned above, I have costed out the first three years of this project and have considerable experience and contacts within the wildlife management/conservation industry. I would welcome the opportunity to talk more about how this project could be realised.

#### Hikurangi as a Destination

Hikurangi is not very well signposted as a good destination to stop in to on your travels around Northland. It is also not very well marketed around the wider Whangarei area. There is minimal information about Hikurangi in the local information centres and there are no attractive signs along SH1 showing what attractions and activities are in Hikurangi for people to stop in and try. We would like Hikurangi to be better promoted by way of new upgraded signage at the North and South entrances to Hikurangi, as well as at the town end of Valley Road entering Hikurangi. We also support further information being displayed at the isite such as brochures and posters.

#### Family and Youth Activities

Hikurangi has limited accessible outdoor resources able to be utilized for children and families in their leisure time. With large sports grounds, a small run down skate park, and Lake Waro, there are opportunities for expansion and upgrades to make more activities available. Walking and cycling tracks are highly sought after in our community, and these could be placed in various locations such as the rugby grounds, the land near the lake, or alongside the railway line. The skatepark could be upgraded to be larger and use surrounding land to include a bmx track. Lake Waro is extremely popular especially in the summer months, but it lacks shade and a variety of areas for multiple families to enjoy family activities in their own space.

Hikurangi Sports Grounds

The local rugby club boasts some large fields which are largely unused outside of rugby

training and game days. With the land available it is possible to add a variety of other sports assets to the grounds to support more sports being available in Hikurangi. With the bowling club and the multisports and tennis club right next door, it would be beneficial to upgrade the clubrooms to be more of a "sports hub" that can expand to include sports such as soccer, cricket, and even indoor sports like gymnastics. Often for anyone in our district wanting to play these sports, they are required to travel up to an hour to reach their local club. In some family instances it is not possible for this travel to take place, nor is it reasonable for the children to experience such long travel times which often result in late nights getting home.

#### Gomez Park

The WDC owns a large block of land on Gomez Road which has previously been identified as a potential development site for "Gomez Park", a sought after outdoor recreational facility. With the possibility to bring some dying sports back to life by providing much sort after event grounds, sports such as archery and mountain biking will have a chance at keeping their clubs alive within our district. The "trail track" will provide much needed funding to local community groups if they are able to host a horse trek, mountain bike ride, fun run/walk, or trail bike ride up to once per month. The benefits of developing this land far outweighs the cons and this project has already been on council development plans in the past, so half the work has already been done.

### WDC 2021 Submission: New bylaws needed for mandatory desexing and microchipping of cats in the Whangarei Area.



Northland Vet Group is the largest Veterinary Practice in Northland and we cover both large and small animal veterinary work from Helena Bay to Waipu.

There is a huge problem with stray, lost and abandoned cats in the Whangarei area. Many of our clients in both rural and urban domiciles report the presence of unowned and unwanted cats that appear and fight for food and territory, biting and injuring their own domestic pets in the process of day-to-day survival. Sometimes these cats are not seen, so this is the first evidence of their presence.

These unowned cats breed rapidly so the problem is an increasing one. A female cat can produce 2-4 litters a year with no particular breeding seasons. Each litter can number an average of 3-5 kittens that are sexually mature from 4 months old. De-sexing would stop this population growth. The local SPCA de-sexes many cats, but are becoming overwhelmed by the sheer numbers of unowned and unwanted cats.

Stray, lost and abandoned cats and those not adequately fed decimate wild bird populations. With the aims for a predator-free New Zealand by 2050 it is essential to have some effective programs in place to control the populations of these very efficient hunters in our extensive bush and native flora areas.

Microchipping gives each cat a unique number. It is the size of a grain of rice implanted under the skin, like a vaccination, usually during the de-sexing procedure by a vet or vet nurse. Vet practice and SPCA staff use a microchip reader that scans the chips radio signal and detects the unique 16 digit number. The number is registered on a database that links the cat to the owner's details. Without the registration, the animal cannot be reunited with an owner. When a stray, lost or abandoned, sick or injured cat is presented to the vet, the lack of a microchip means that there are delays in diagnosis and treatment for the patient due to a lack of owner permission.

There is a worldwide movement towards the mandatory microchipping of cats: the UK and Japan are currently considering new guidelines and it is compulsory in France, Belgium, Greece and some parts of Spain and Australia.

I would like to suggest the following solutions to the above problems:

 Financially contribute to a Whangarei "Chip and snip" programme involving local vet practices. This would provide subsidized de-sexing, microchipping and registering of companion cats for people on benefits/pensions and low incomes.

### New bylaws and resources urgently needed for the management of 'lost' and abandoned cats and kittens that are suffering from starvation and cruelty; damaging our environment; and creating problems for residents and businesses in our community.

I am a resident in the Whangarei district. I am aware that people in all suburbs have problems with 'lost' and abandoned cats and kittens, whether it be one or two cats or colonies of 20-30. These unowned and unwanted cats and kittens create many different problems and cause unnecessary anxiety, work and expense for residents and businesses, and damage to native wildlife.

#### Lost and abandoned cats and kittens are:

- 1. Suffering:
  - from chronic dehydration, starvation, constipation, tooth decay, flea and worm infestations, disease and untreated injuries

#### 2. Victims of a disturbing range of cruelty and abuse

- 3. Creating a nuisance and problems for residents:
  - spreading diseases to pets such as cat flu and feline aids
  - getting into fights and causing injuries to pets creating unnecessary and expensive vet bills
  - breeding in garages, garden sheds and under homes damaging the insulation

#### 4. A health and hygiene issue:

- eating pets' food, and stealing people's food from kitchen benches and tables
- causing flea infestations in carpets, and skin infections from flea bites
- interrupting sleep when fighting and mating
- dying under homes in inaccessible places creating a revolting smell
- spraying inside homes damaging carpets and furniture
- spraying on fences and outside walls creating a gross smell all year round
- leaving faeces in gardens a health hazard for young children
- carry toxoplasmosis contagious to immune comprised people

#### Creating daily anxiety and distress in kind and caring residents:

- who hate seeing tiny, vulnerable, kittens that are skinny and starving, often with the mother cat desperately looking for food
- who have sick, malnourished and sometimes injured adult and juvenile cats hanging around, many with eye infections from untreated cat flu
- who know these cats have no future and there is no help available

#### 6. Damaging our environment:

- predating on native species birds, small mammals, lizards and insects
- competing with native species for food and water resources
- spreading diseases such as toxoplasmosis

#### 7. Creating a nuisance for business owners:

- shoppers seeing starving cats and kittens eating out of rubbish bins
- employees taking time off work to take boxes of kittens found at their workplace to the SPCA
- cats breeding out the back of cafes, restaurants and supermarkets

The SPCA prioritises sick and injured animals and is not obligated to accept 'lost' cats and kittens. In January 2019, the Whangarei SPCA removed both their 'drop in' boxes for dogs/puppies and cats/kittens for out of hours use. They no longer lend humane live capture traps for catching semi-wild or simply scared pet cats. They do not accept 'stray' cats from the community any more. This means the number of 'lost' cats and kittens will rapidly escalate.

I would like the WDC to help solve this problem:

- 1. Introduce new by/QWS mandating that all companion cats are de-sexed, microchipped and registered (on the NZ Companion Animal Register) by b months of age - a once in the cat's lifetime cost.
- 2. Provide and financially contribute to subsidised de-sexing, microchipping and registering programmes throughout year for people on low incomes. Some councils in NZ already provide this service by working with their local vet clinics and/or SPCA.

Over time, both these measures would help reduce the number of lost and abandoned cats and kittens in the community. Mandatory de-sexing would also reduce the number of unwanted cats and kittens taken to cat shelters. Mandatory microchipping and registering would enable many lost cats and kittens to be reunited with their owners.

### WDC 2021 Submission: New bylaws needed for mandatory desexing and microchipping of cats in the Whangarei area.

There is a huge problem with stray, lost and abandoned cats in the Whangarei area. Many of our clients in both rural and urban domiciles report the presence of unowned and unwanted cats that appear and fight for food and territory, biting and injuring their own domestic pets in the process of day-to-day survival. Sometimes these cats are not seen, so this is the first evidence of their presence.

These unowned cats breed rapidly so the problem is an increasing one. A female cat can produce 2-4 litters a year with no particular breeding seasons. Each litter can number an average of 3-5 kittens that are sexually mature from 4 months old. De-sexing would stop this population growth. The local SPCA de-sexes many cats, but are becoming overwhelmed by the sheer numbers of unowned and unwanted cats.

Stray, lost and abandoned cats and those not adequately fed decimate wild bird populations. With the aims for a predator-free New Zealand by 2050 it is essential to have some effective programs in place to control the populations of these very efficient hunters in our extensive bush and native flora areas.

Microchipping gives each cat a unique number. It is the size of a grain of rice implanted under the skin, like a vaccination, usually during the de-sexing procedure by a vet or vet nurse. Vet practice and SPCA staff use a microchip reader that scans the chips radio signal and detects the unique 16 digit number. The number is registered on a database that links the cat to the owner's details. Without the registration, the animal cannot be reunited with an owner. When a stray, lost or abandoned, sick or injured cat is presented to the vet, the lack of a microchip means that there are delays in diagnosis and treatment for the patient due to a lack of owner permission.

There is a worldwide movement towards the mandatory microchipping of cats: the UK and  $\,^{\prime}$ Japan are currently considering new guidelines and it is compulsory in France, Belgium, Greece and some parts of Spain and Australia.

I would like to suggest the following solutions to the above problems:

1. Financially contribute to a Whangarei "Chip and snip" programme involving local vet practices. This would provide subsidized de-sexing, microchipping and registering of companion cats for people on benefits/pensions and low incomes. Garchard

Please consider putting in a roundabout at the intersection of puriri park Road and maunu road. Already dangerous pulling out and with the imminent arrival of 37 new state houses that just about 100% of public submissions were against....but WDC decided to build anyway, the intersection will only get worse. Several instances of Pompellier College children nearly being hit by traffic as they cross, walking eastbound towards town.

Apart from spending money however, can I suggest you copy the blueprint of European cities for example and look at 'The Loop'. There is currently the new parking by the bridge and the Ray White building. There is some fantastic public amenities around there now, but take ten steps along the path and you're back to looking at bare land and worn down rusted sheds/warehouses. Given the amount of complaining locals seem to do about parking, lack of housing and traffic, why not open up the land along the walkway to apartment developments and retail and the ground floor. It would generate money, beautify the area, allow for new retail outlets away from the town centre and encourage people to diversify where they park to go shopping. Could easy put in a stipulation that the developments would have to have some element of Hunterwasser design on the exterior to tie in with the town basin. That, combined with the Okuru Landing project might actually encourage people to stop in Whangarei, instead of driving through to the Bay of Islands as is currently the case. Just a thought

WDC 2021 Submission: New bylaws needed for mandatory desexing and microchipping of cats in the Whangarei area.

There is a huge problem with stray, lost and abandoned cats in the Whangarei area. Many of our clients in both rural and urban domiciles report the presence of unowned and unwanted cats that appear and fight for food and territory, biting and injuring their own domestic pets in the process of day-to-day survival. Sometimes these cats are not seen, so this is the first evidence of their presence.

These unowned cats breed rapidly so the problem is an increasing one. A female cat can produce 2-4 litters a year with no particular breeding seasons. Each litter can number an average of 3-5 kittens that are sexually mature from 4 months old. De-sexing would stop this population growth. The local SPCA de-sexes many cats, but are becoming overwhelmed by the sheer numbers of unowned and unwanted cats.

Stray, lost and abandoned cats and those not adequately fed decimate wild bird populations. With the aims for a predator-free New Zealand by 2050 it is essential to have some effective programs in place to control the populations of these very efficient hunters in our extensive bush and native flora areas.

Microchipping gives each cat a unique number. It is the size of a grain of rice implanted under the skin, like a vaccination, usually during the de-sexing procedure by a vet or vet nurse. Vet practice and SPCA staff use a microchip reader that scans the chips radio signal and detects the unique 16 digit number. The number is registered on a database that links the cat to the owner's details. Without the registration, the animal cannot be reunited with an owner. When a stray, lost or abandoned, sick or injured cat is presented to the vet, the lack of a microchip means that there are delays in diagnosis and treatment for the patient due to a lack of owner permission.

There is a worldwide movement towards the mandatory microchipping of cats: the UK and  $\,'$ Japan are currently considering new guidelines and it is compulsory in France, Belgium, Greece and some parts of Spain and Australia.

I would like to suggest the following solutions to the above problems:

# Tell us what you think - any further comments on key issues or other points raised in the Consultation document:

The Parua Bay and Districts Community Centre Society Incorporated ("the Society") owns land on Whangarei Heads Road which accommodates the Manaia Squash Club, the Manaia Bowling Club and in its Community Centre provides a location for many community sporting and recreational endeavours. Through its management the Society has a close relationship with the adjacent sporting fields owned by the Mervyn and Annie Ross Charitable Trust which in turn is used by a range of community sports teams. When sports teams use the Ross Trust fields they are required to use changing facilities and a singular toilet located beneath the community hall. Although some improvements have been made by user groups the changing rooms and toilet are rudimentary and totally unacceptable for use by today's standards. Currently, there are no public toilets in Parua Bay area and the WDC is asked to make provision within the LTP to enhance the facilities for users of the Ross Trust Fields.

The Society, its community hall and the surrounding fields are a hugely important sporting and recreational asset to Parua Bay and Districts but its facilities are now in excess of 30 years old and are in need of enhancement and capital expenditure.

In essence the Society has been providing a civic service to the community which it serves. Parua Bay and Districts is recognised by the WDC as a strategic growth node and the Society will continue to play an important part in enhancing the amenity values of the area. The Society has just completed a review of its operations and there is a future focus on providing multifaceted sporting facilities.

The Society supports the proposed Parua Bay Recreation Reserve located on WDC land adjacent to the Society. Currently the Society does not have sufficient land to accommodate the needs of all sports teams and the existing car parking is full to capacity when community events take place. The proposed car parking in the adjacent Parua Bay Recreation Reserve will ensure that road safety is enhanced and that visitors don't park on the berm of Whangarei Heads Road when attending events. The WDC will be asked to resurface / pave the Society's carpark when the Parua Bay Recreation Reserve occurs. Currently the Society's carparks are utilized by School buses taking children to and from Whangarei and in the absence of a suitable turning bay the buses use the Society's carpark and in the process have damaged the parking area.

The likely implementation of a multi-use sports club at the Society and the need to create new playing surfaces to accommodate the needs of netball and other sports will likely result in an application to the WDC for seed funding to enable the Society to engage Sport Northland to prepare a case study on creating a similar sports hub as they had done for the KDC with regard to Dargaville Sportsville.

Parua Bay and Districts has grown exponentially over the last five years and this has put pressure on the facilities operated by the Society and it is submitted that the WDC should in its LTP make better provision for Parua Bay and Districts by investing in the Society and ensuring that it can continue to meet the needs of its community.

In summary, to reflect the very important part that the Society plays in delivering amenity values to the residents of Parua Bay and Whangarei Heads the Society requests that in the first quarter of the 10 year plan the WDC:

1. Creates appropriate toileting and changing facilities within the Society for users of the Ross Trust Fields.

2. In conjunction with development of the Parua Bay Recreation Reserve pave the parking areas within the Society.

3. Provide funding to enable the Society to engage Sport Northland to prepare a case study on creating a similar sports hub as they had done for the KDC with regard to Dargaville Sportsville.

4. Make better provision for Parua Bay and Districts by investing in the Society and ensuring that it can continue to meet the needs of its community.

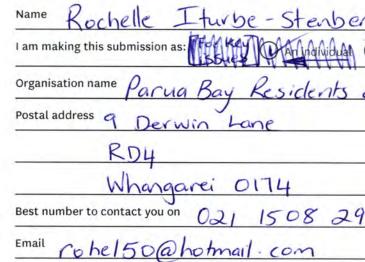

As usual there appears to be minimal funding /resourcing allocated towards the Ruakākā/Bream Bay District, part of Whāngarei that is growing seemingly faster than the infrastructure to support it. WDC needs to engage with Patuharakeke and the community on integrated spatial planning, needs assessments etc for the Ruakākā Bream Bay Area. We cannot see any allocation towards the creation of the cemetery for which land has been purchased.

While the upgrade of sportsfields is positive, we understand that WDC is not committed to providing the carpark for the New Recreation centre planned for Ruakākā. We would like to see this provided for in the LTP. Our rangatahi in particular need more options and services available to them. Many positive developments in our rohe have arisen not through Council initiatives, but through bake sales and sausage sizzles and the hard work of whanau and community (eg. The Skate park).

We support the ongoing and appropriate funding of Māori Partnerships such as Te Karearea. Unfortunately we have been unable to locate where this sits in the budget. However, specific targeted funding is required to implement our newly signed Mana Wahakahono a Rohe Agreement with WDC. There also needs to be dedicated funding to the options and assessment work required to either advance the return of Pukekauri to Patuharakeke or the exploration of possibilities for co-management.

# Submission for WDC 2021 Public Consultation Process

New by-laws are needed for mandatory de-sexing and microchipping of cats in the Whangarei area.

There is a huge problem with stray, lost and abandoned cats in the Whangarei area. These unowned, and not de-sexed, cats and kittens create many different problems for the community. They breed rapidly, so the problem is an increasing one.

Compulsory de-sexing of companion cats would help to slow this population growth. Compulsory microchipping will give each cat an individual identifying number, and compulsory registration on the NZCAR (New Zealand Companion Animal Register) will link the cat to an owner.

There is a worldwide movement towards the mandatory microchipping and de-sexing of companion cats.

I would like the Whangarei District Council to help solve this problem in the following ways:

- Introduce new bylaws mandating that all companion cats are de-sexed, microchipped and registered on the NZCAR (New Zealand Companion Animal Register) by 6 months of age.
- Financially contribute to subsidized de-sexing, microchipping and registering programmes for people on low incomes. Some councils in NZ already provide this service by working with their local vet clinics and/or SPCA.

Over time, both these measures would help to reduce the number of lost and abandoned cats and kittens in the community.

# Tell us what you think - any further comments on key issues or other points raised in the Consultation document:

Support the development of more walking and cycling tracks and would especially like to see something out on the Tutukaka Coast to link the coastal communities, especially in the summer months when people are visiting who want to walk and cycle.

Another possibility is a providing more room for cyclists/walkers out to the Tutukaka Coast. Like to see funding put into management of the roadsides to support the weed work already happening as part of the High Value Areas.

Like to see 'hands-on' management of vegetation on roadsides rather than the use of tractor mowers that leave really ugly, sharp shredded native vegetation plus a whole lot of debris that fills gutters, drains and culverts that then causes flooding issues and damage to roads from water. Employ teams of workers to do the work - less carnage, more care and hopefully less damage and cost to repair in the long term.

Provision of suitable toilet facilities at our beaches to cope with the summer influx of visitors. How does the council propose to fulfil its role in ensuring the protection of terrestrial biodiversity? This should also be considered as part of its action towards climate change. For example - previously WDC has financially assisted private landowners wanting to protect indigenous biodiversity through contributions towards fencing and survey via organisations such as QEII National Trust.
